

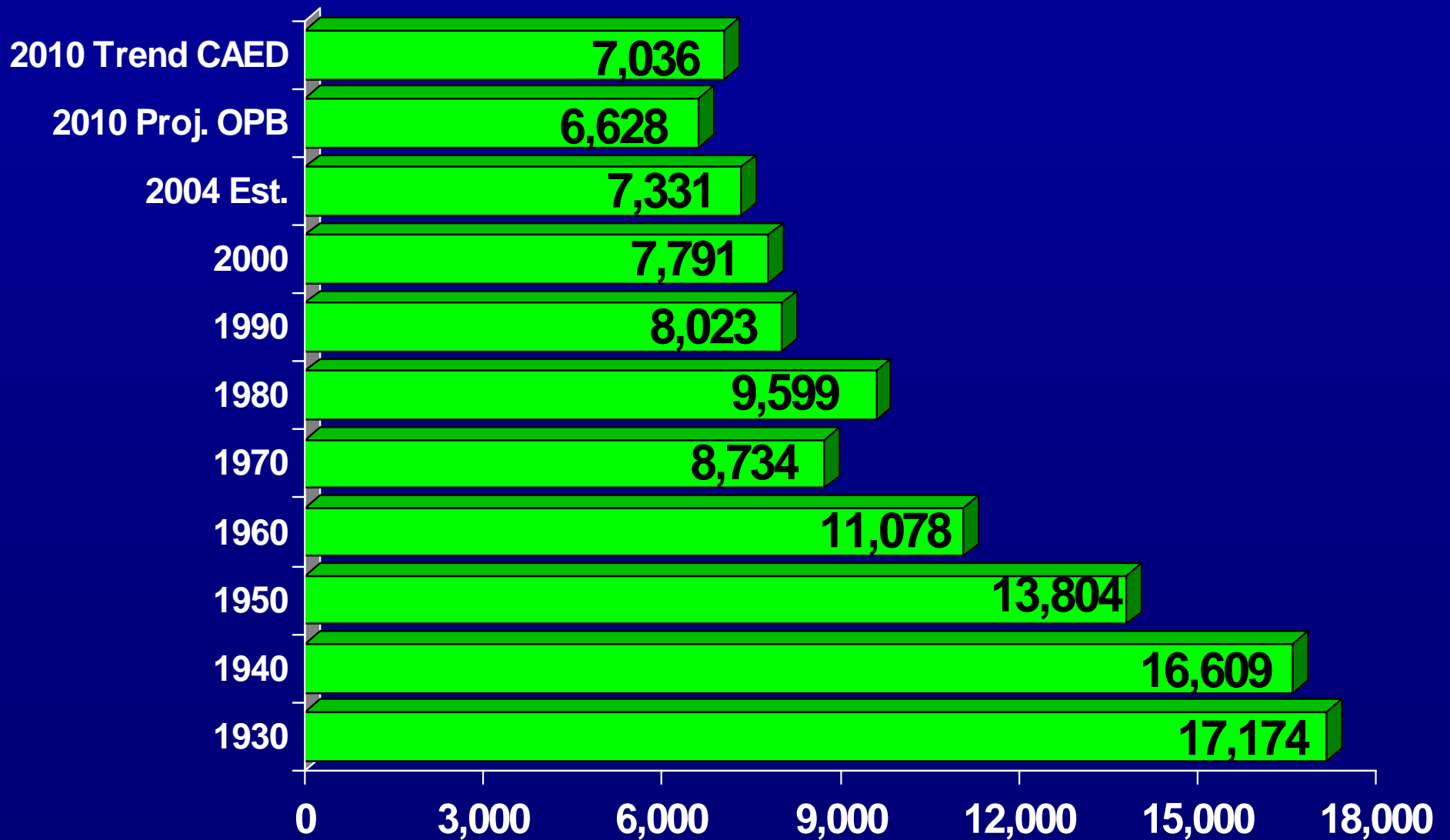

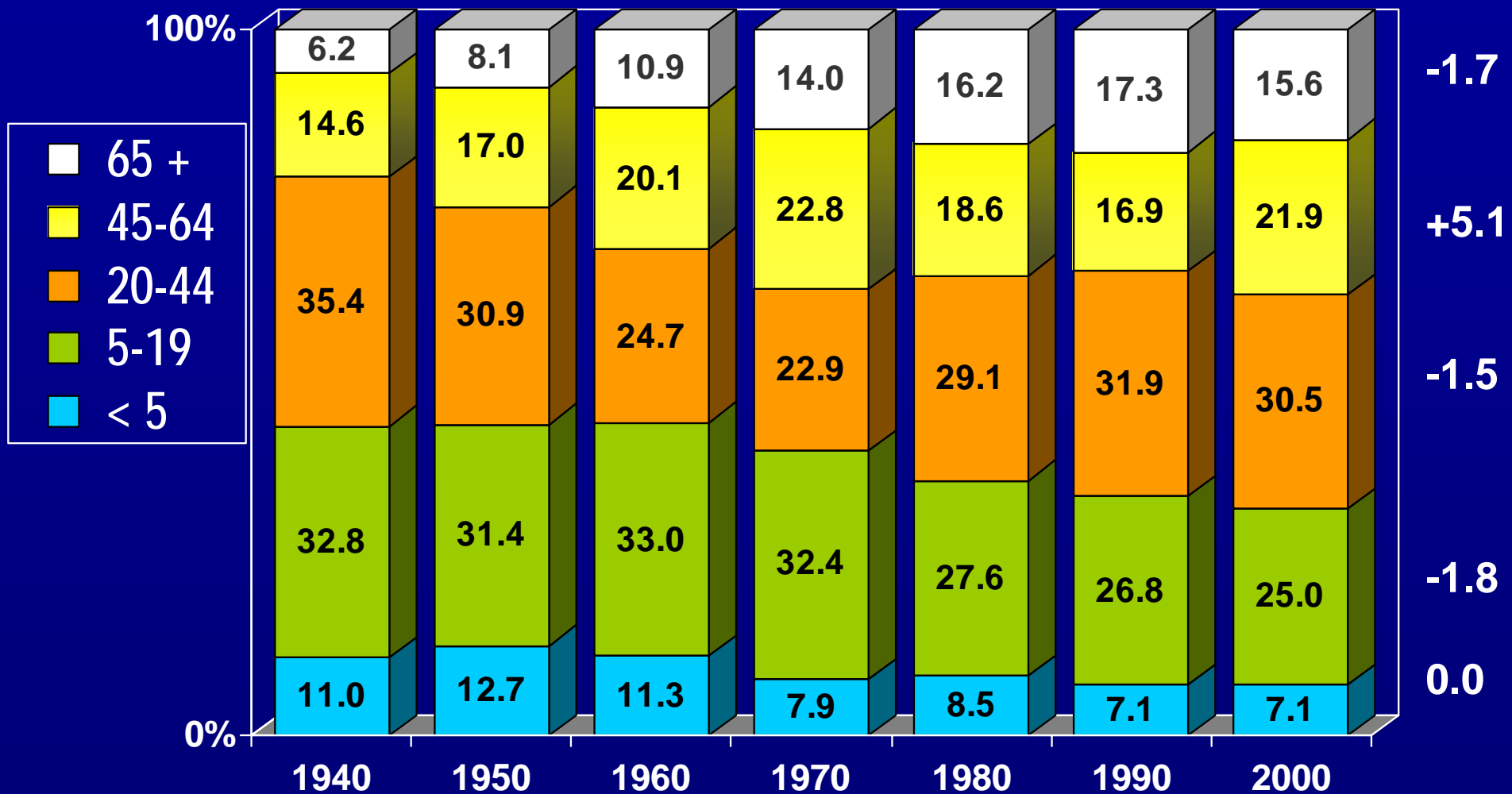
Total Population Randolph County

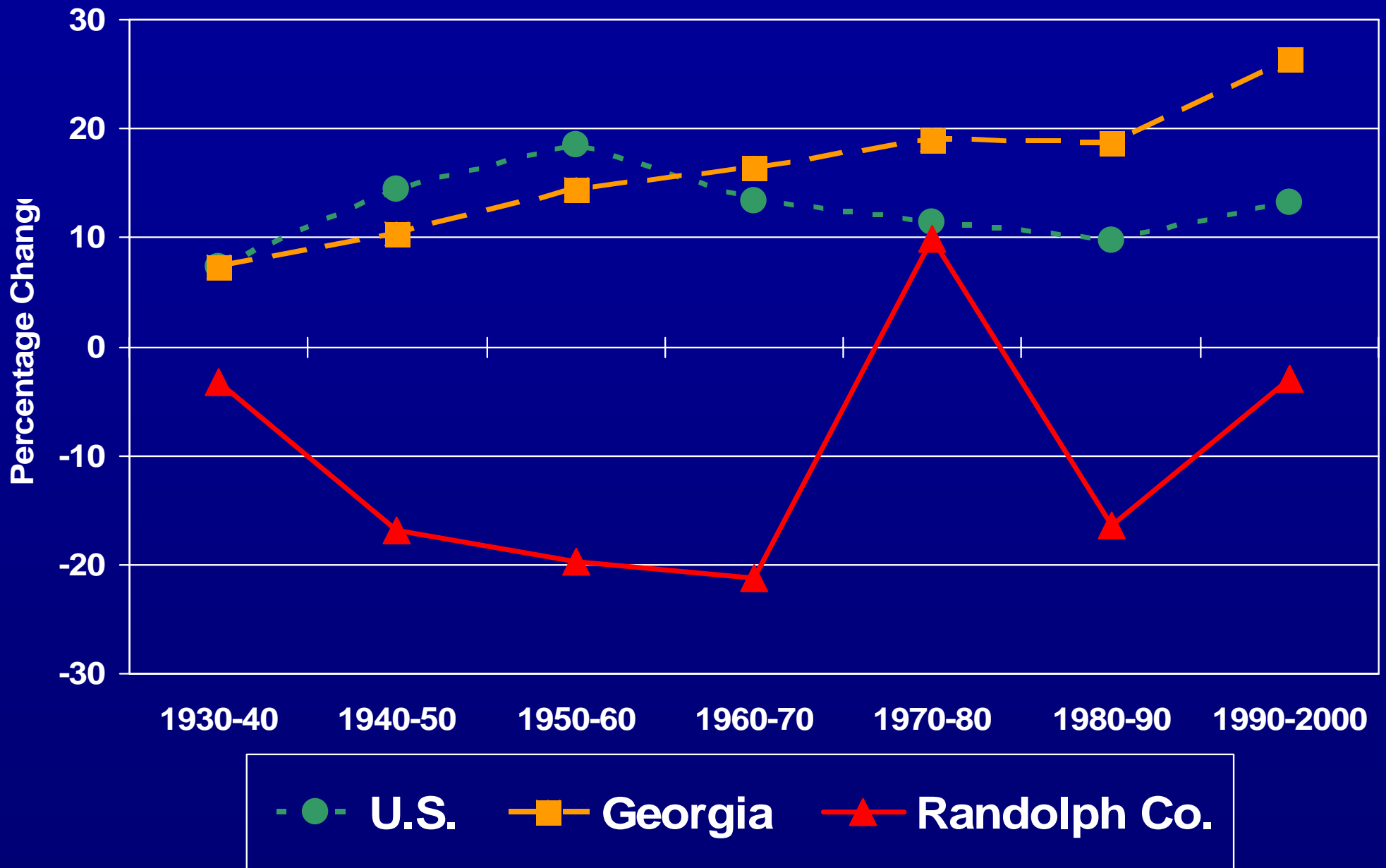

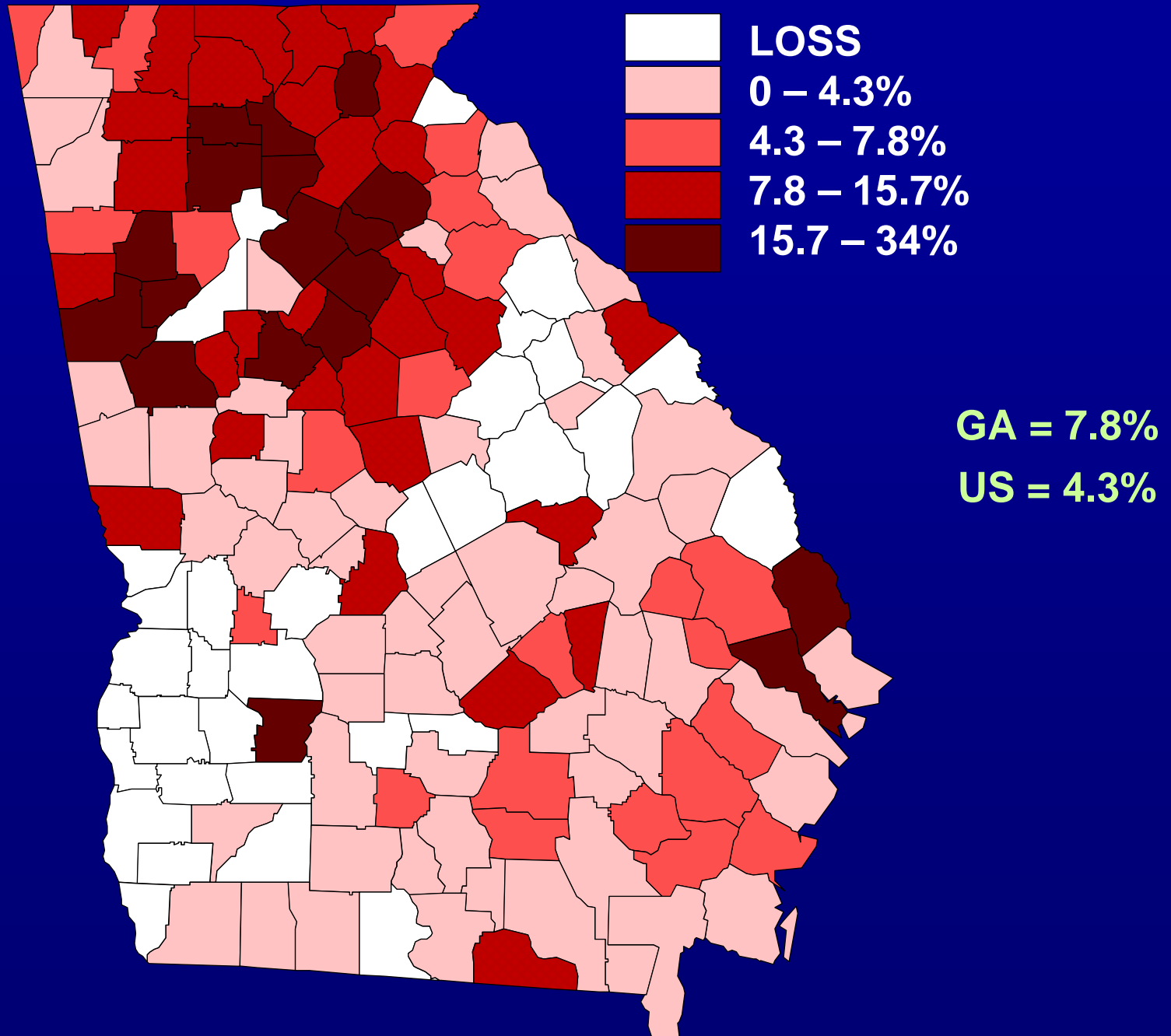

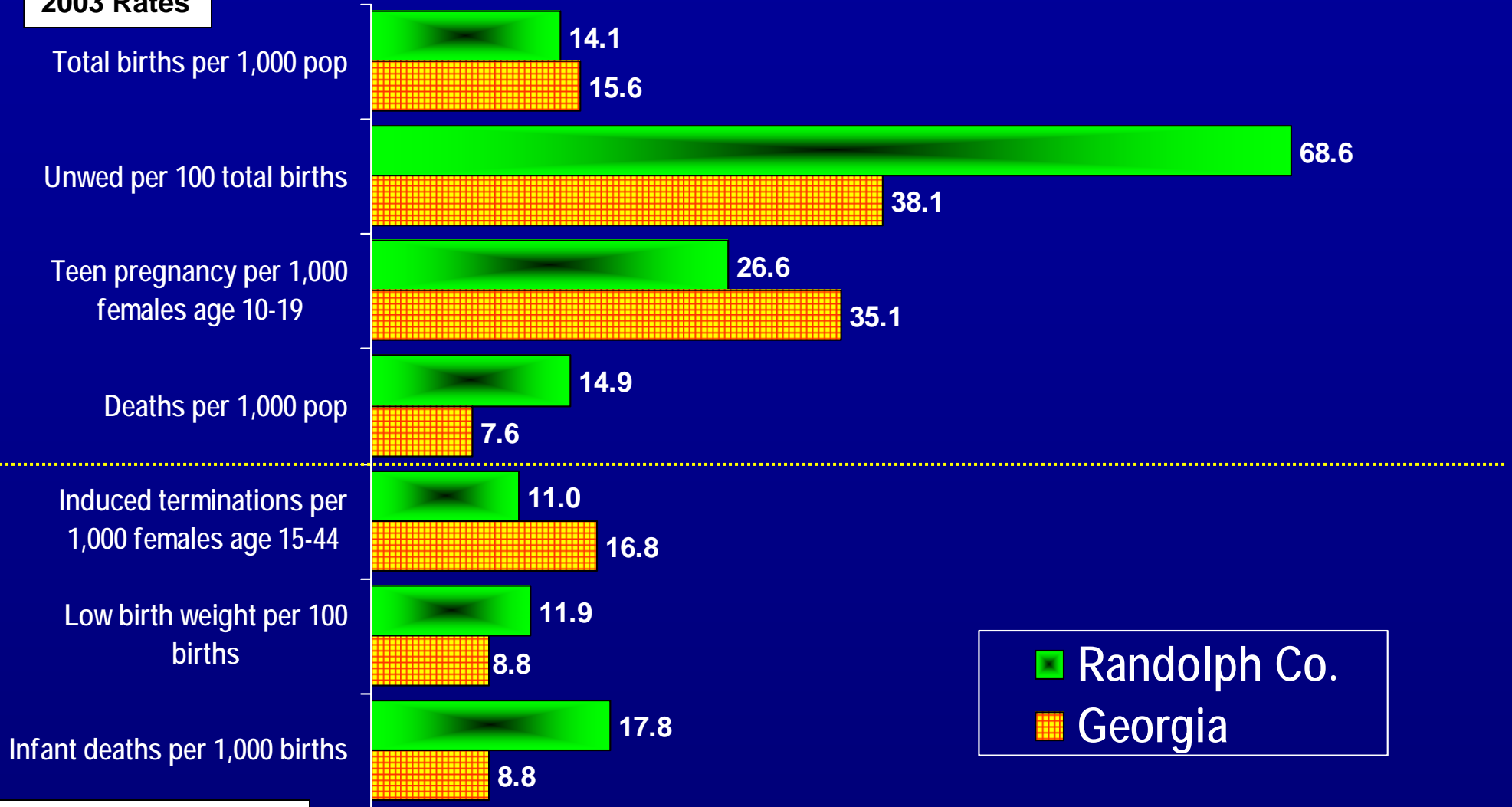

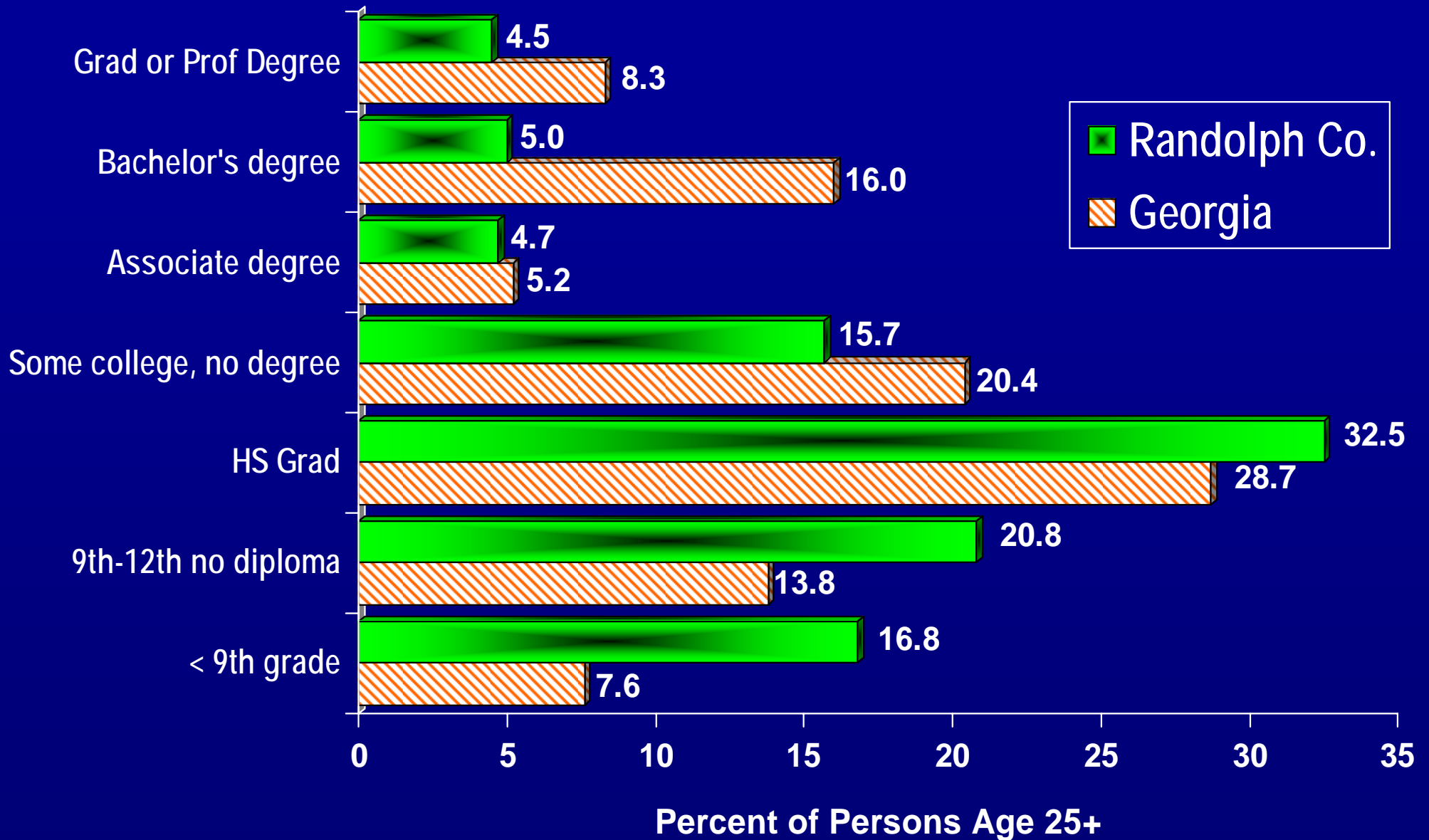

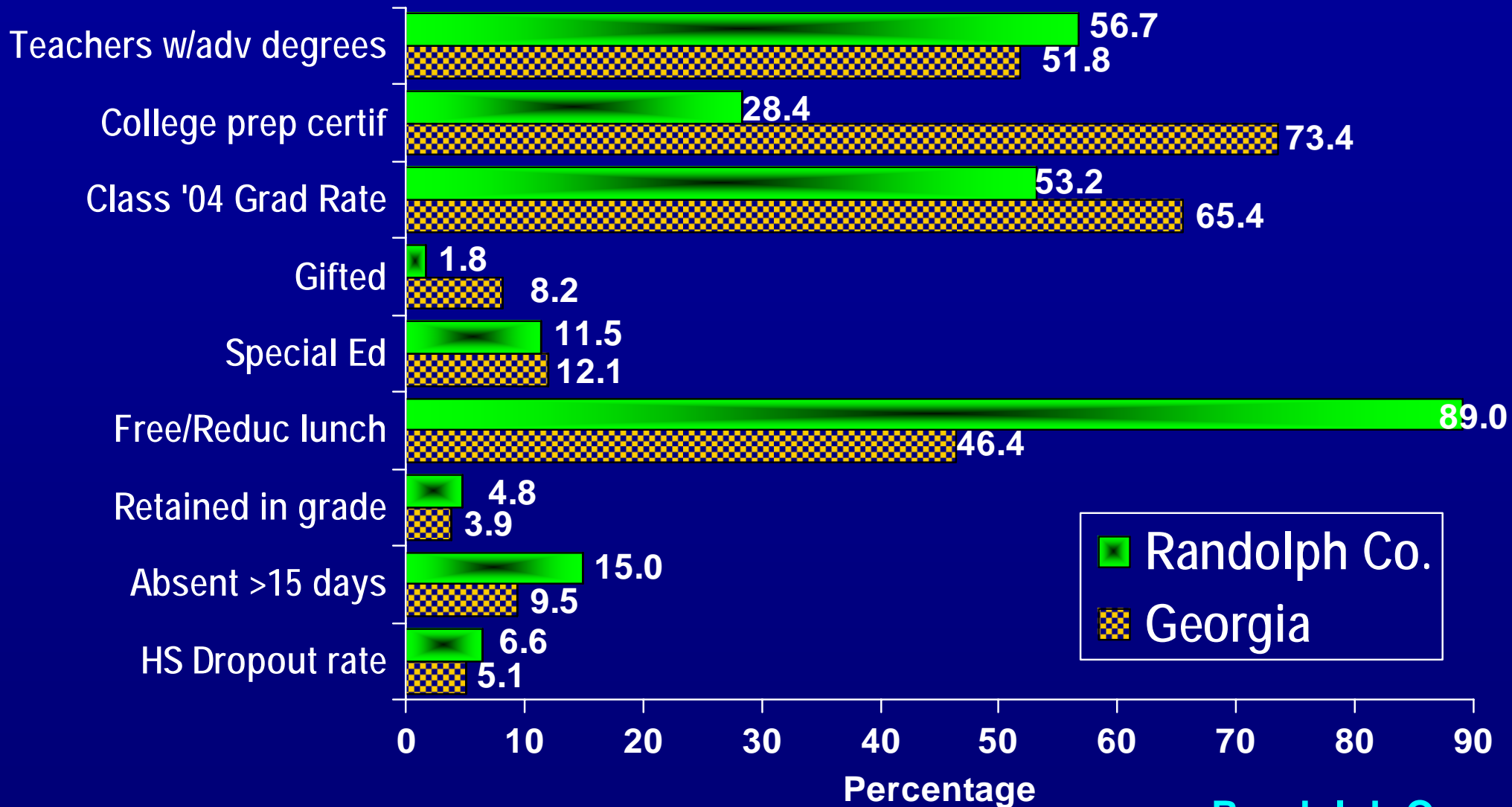

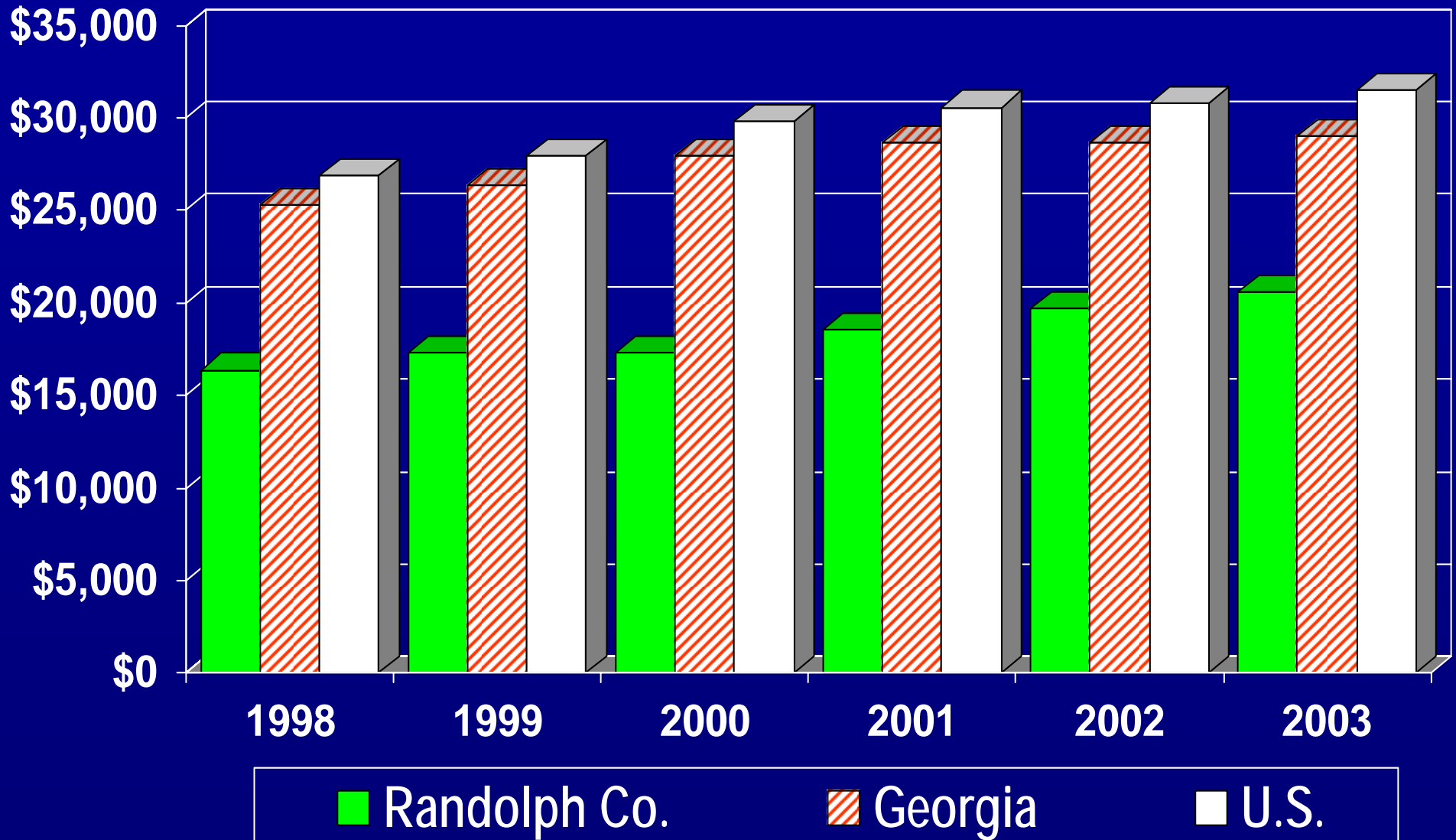

Per Capita Income: 1998-2003

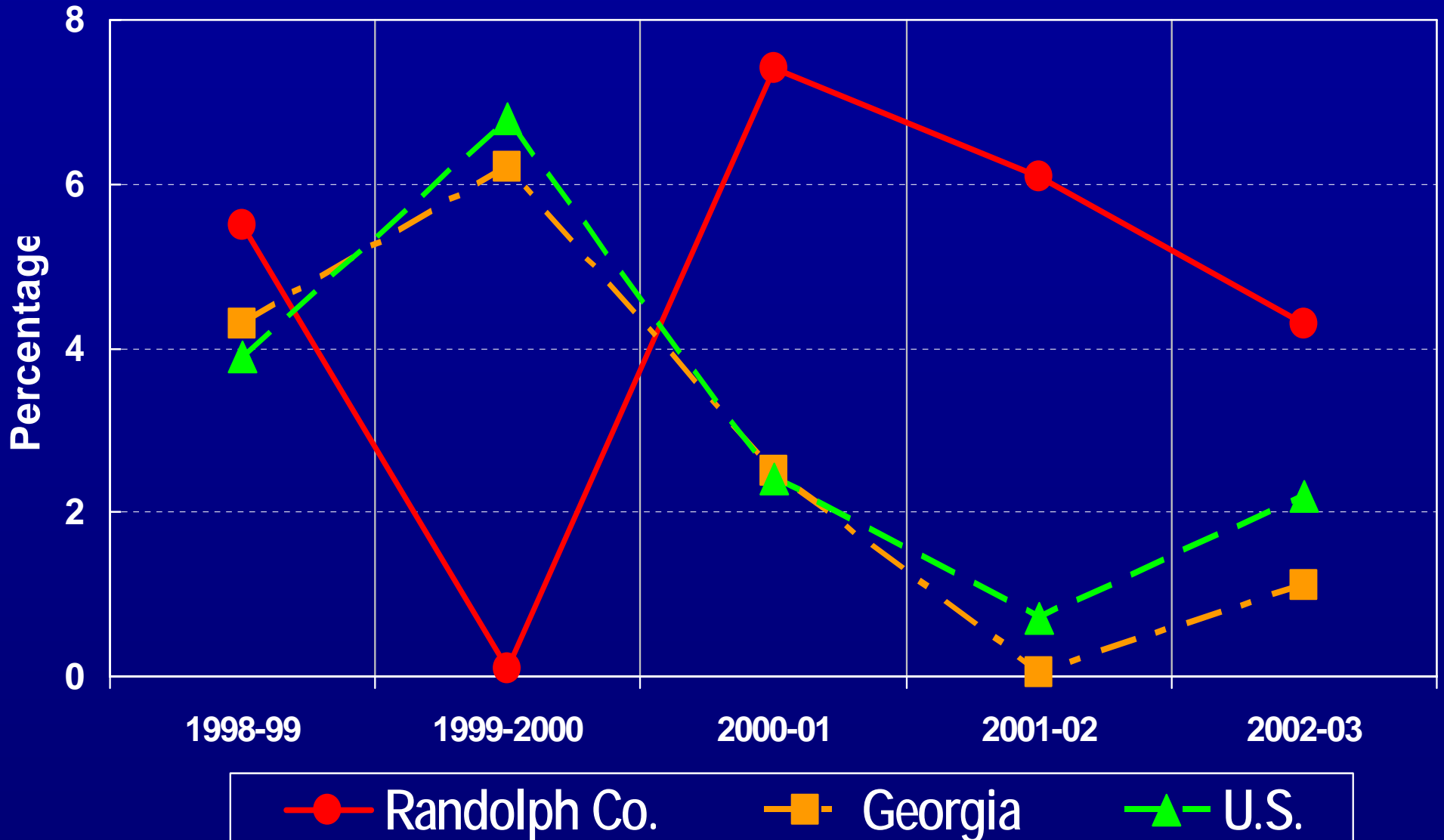

Percentage Change



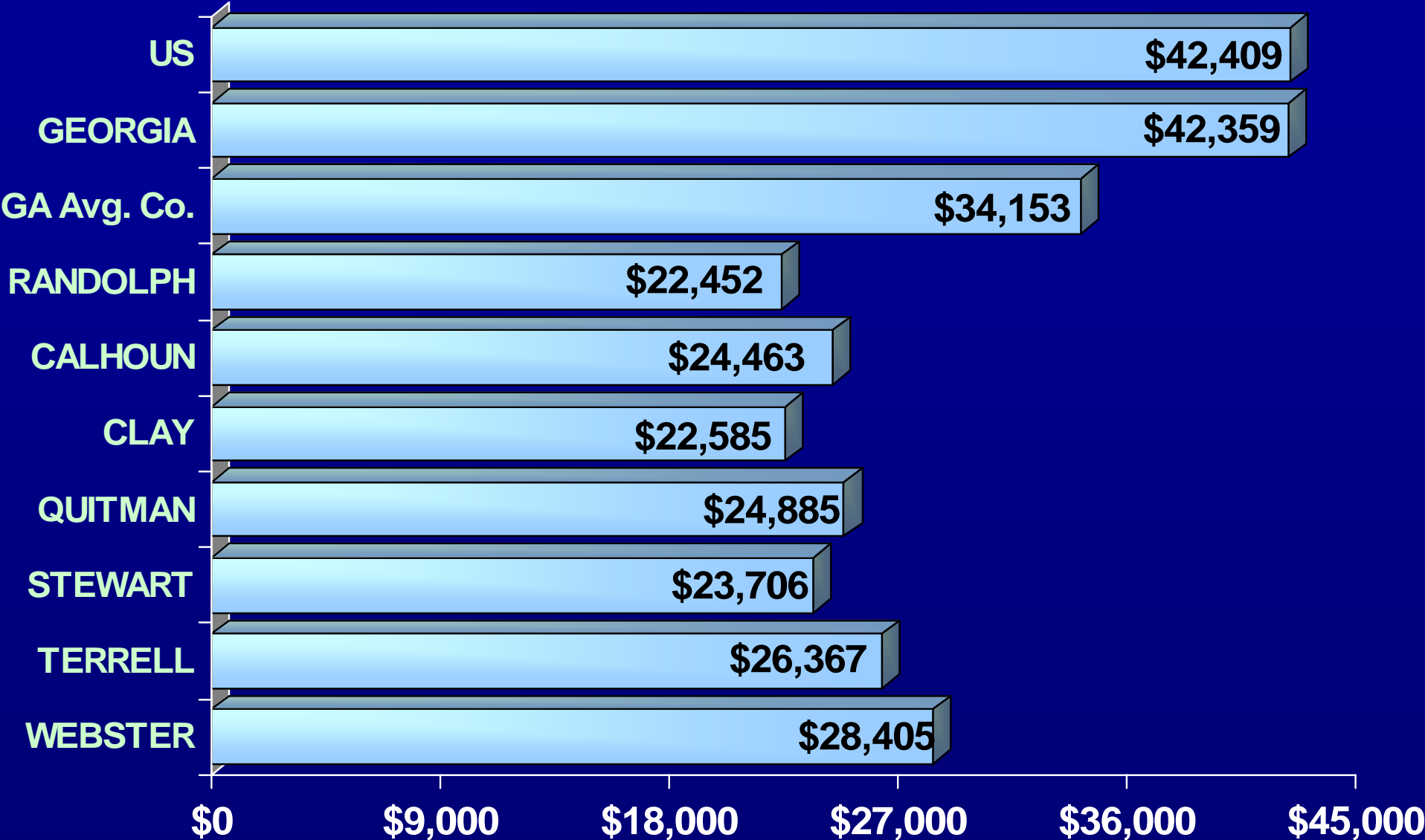

Median Household Income

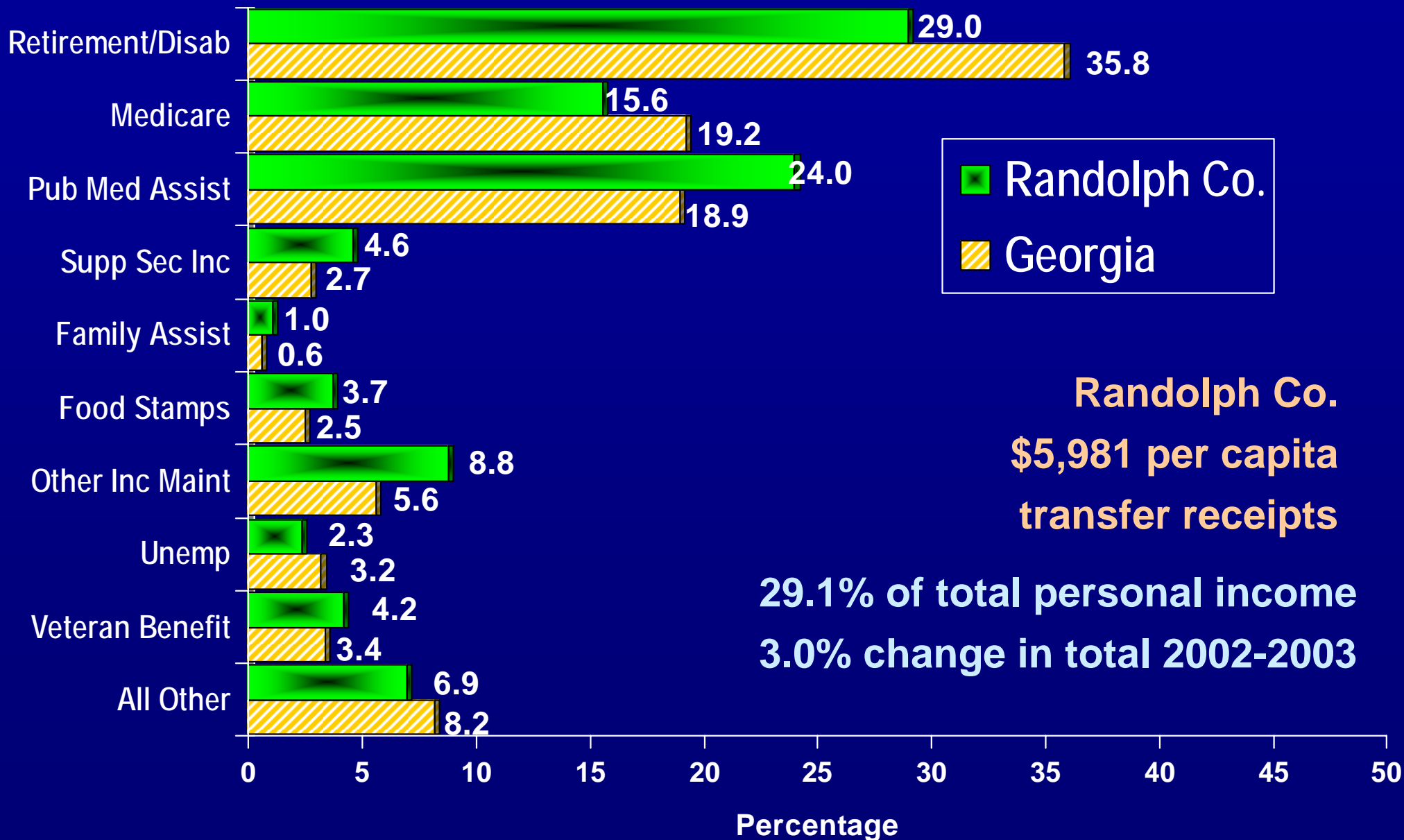
2002 Model-Based Estimates

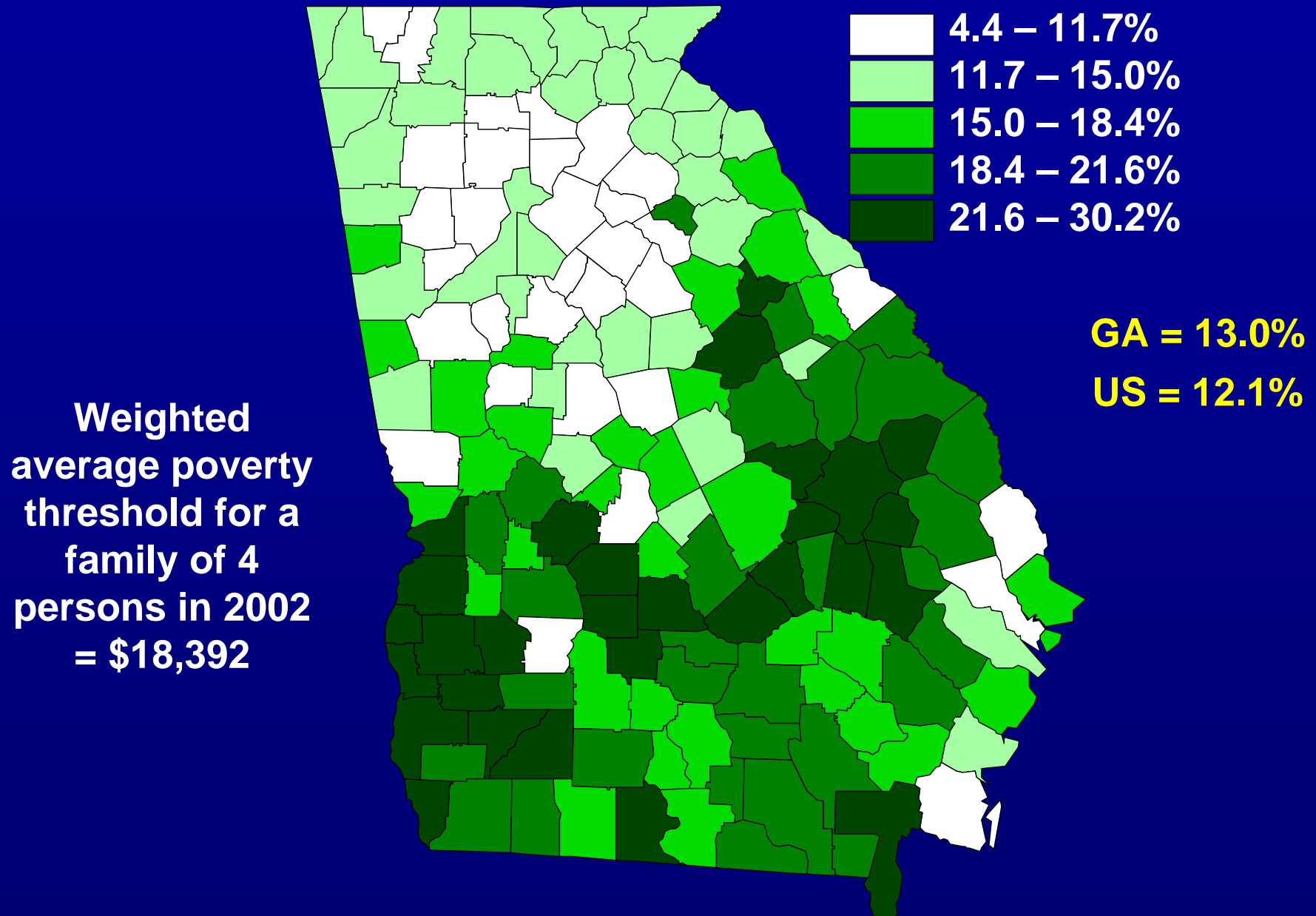

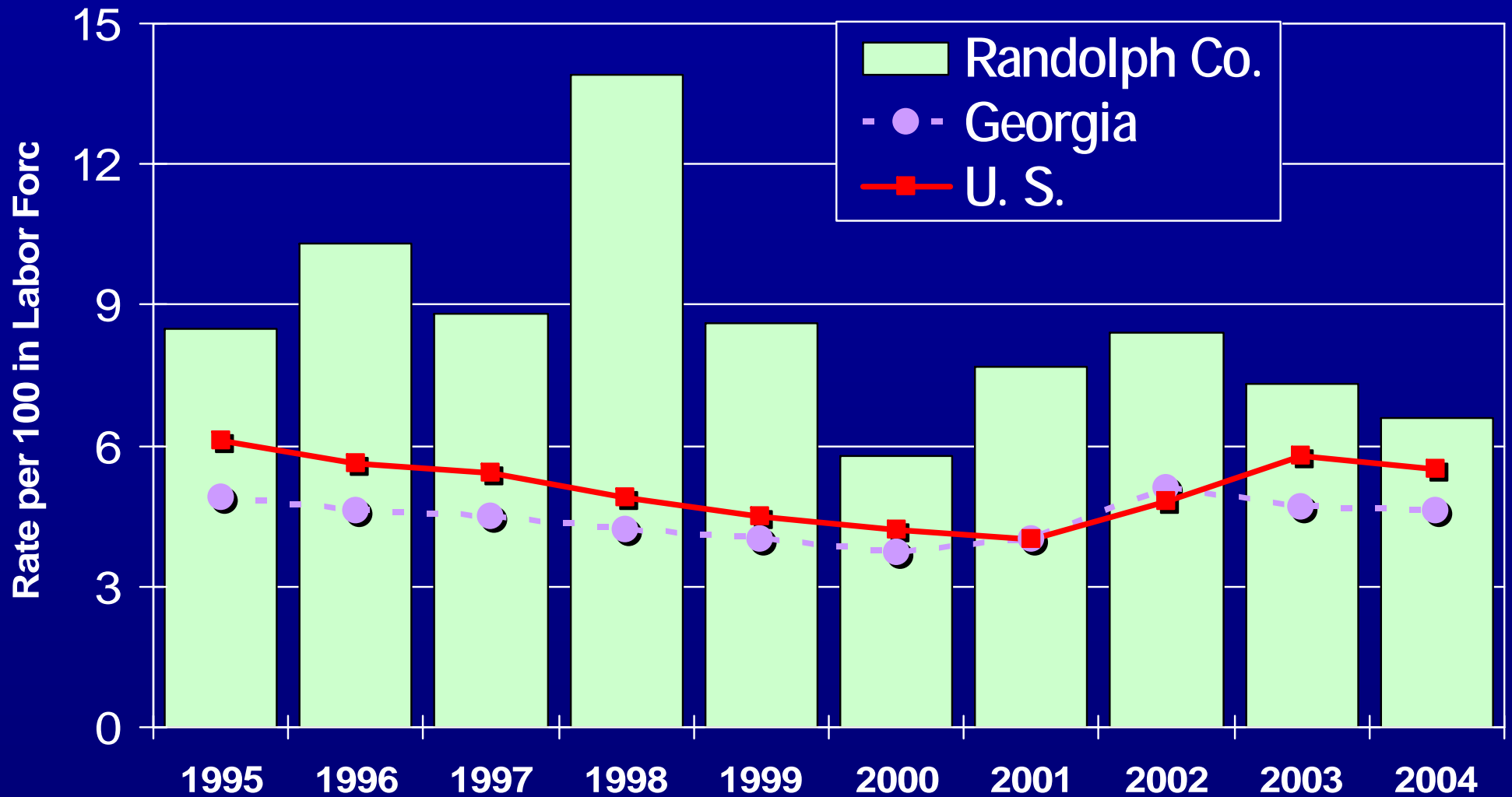

Unemployment Rates



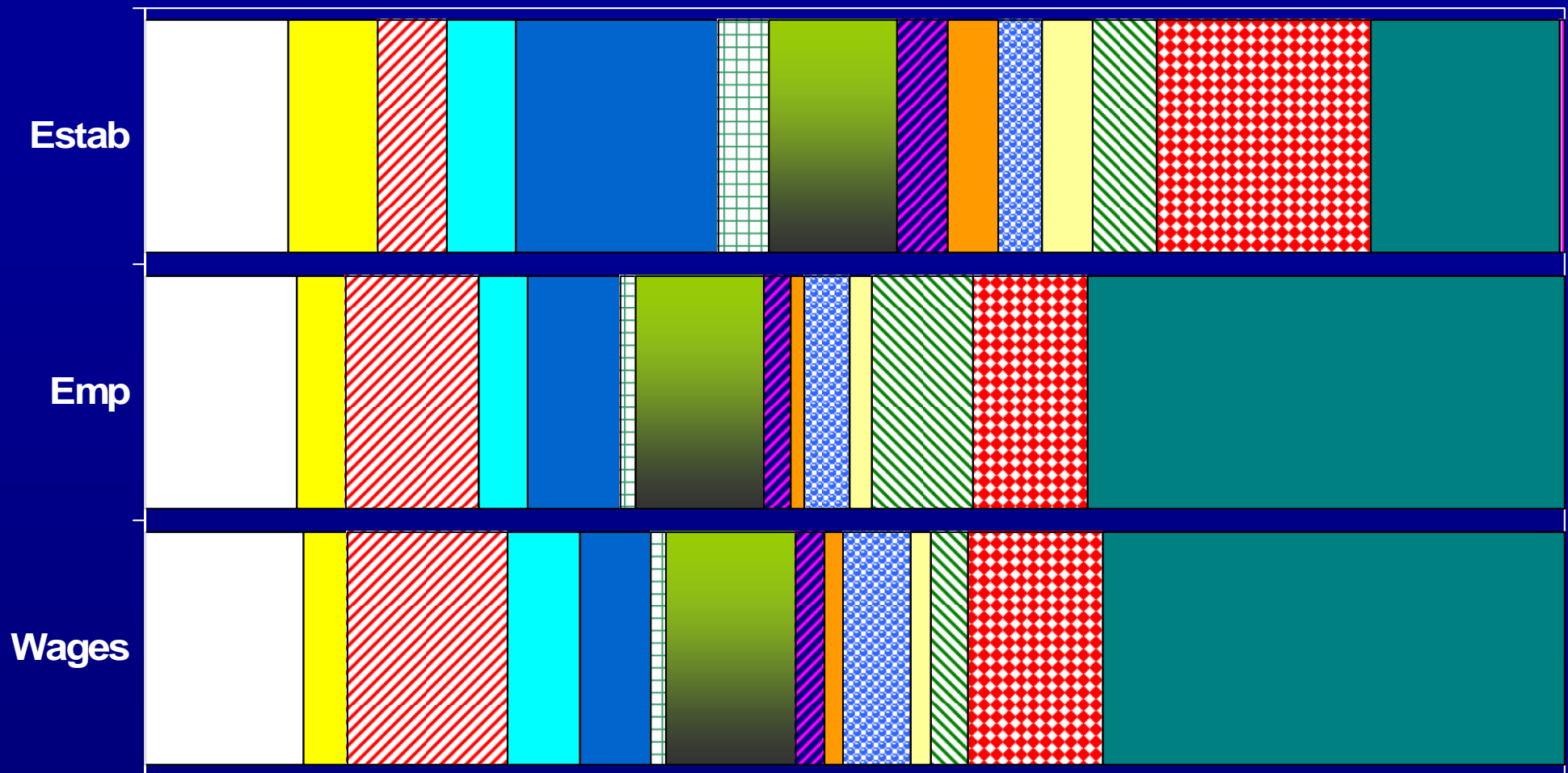

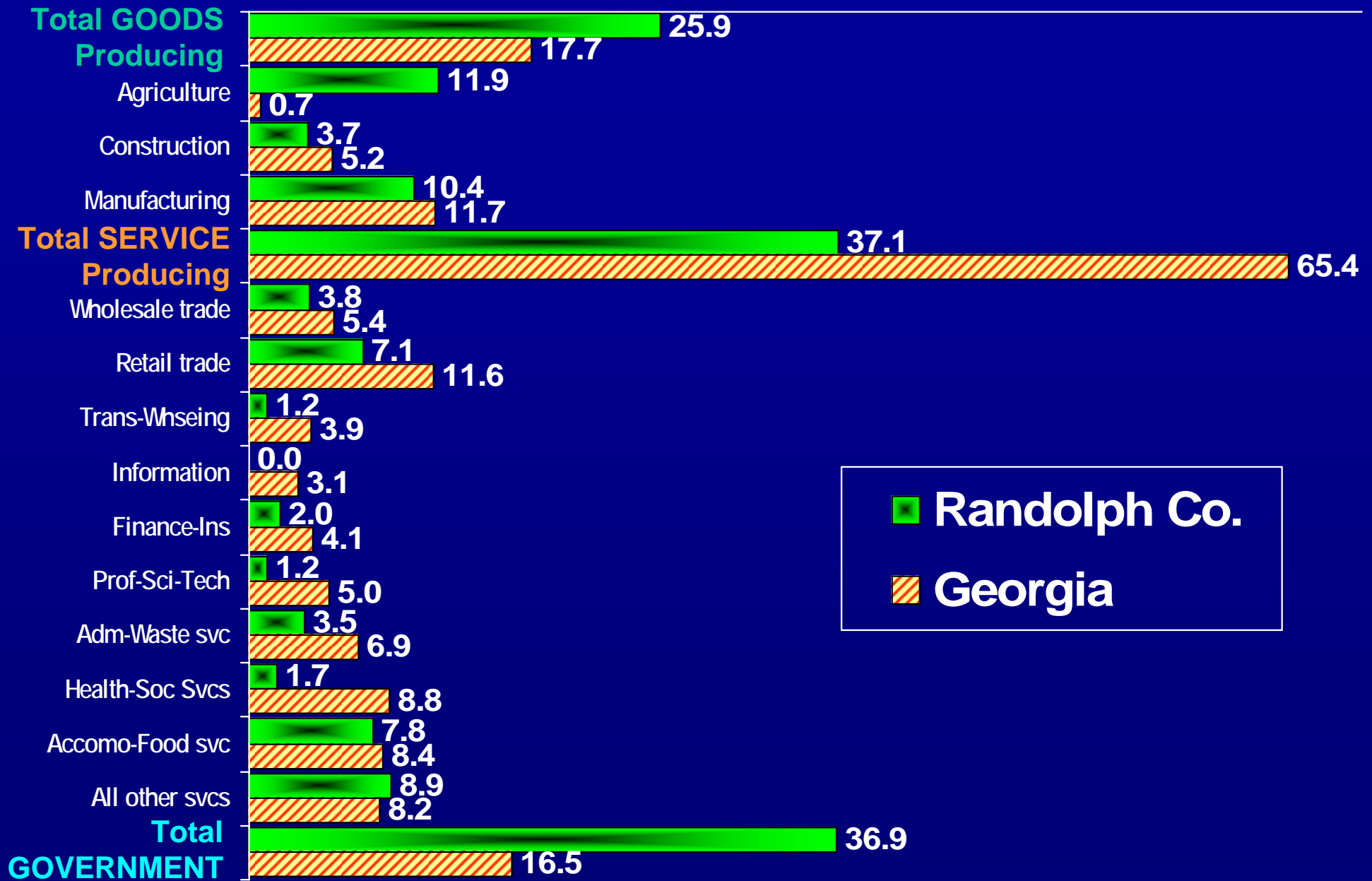

Business Establishments, Employment and Wages Randolph County 2004 Annual Averages, % of Total



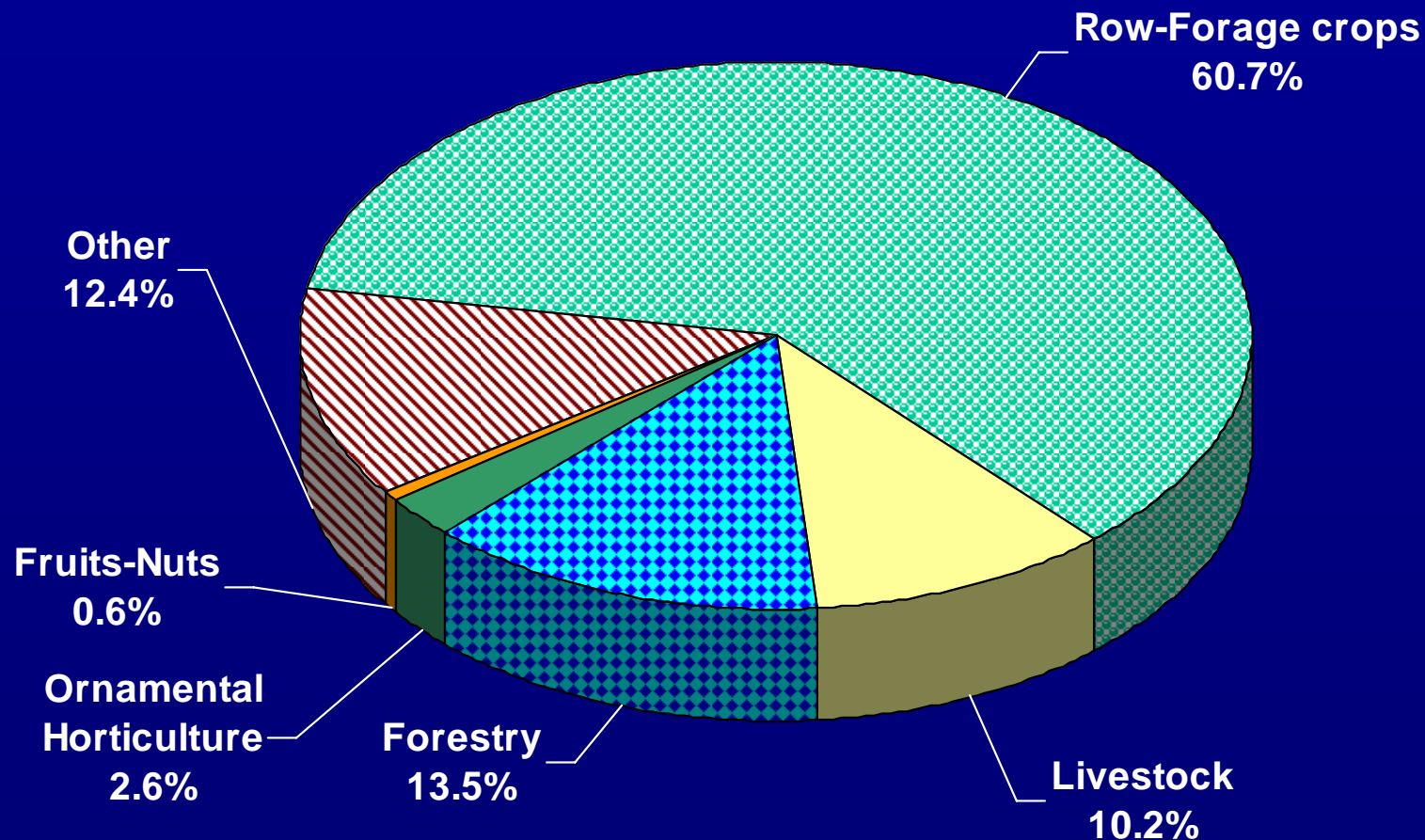

Employment Comparisons by Industry: 2004



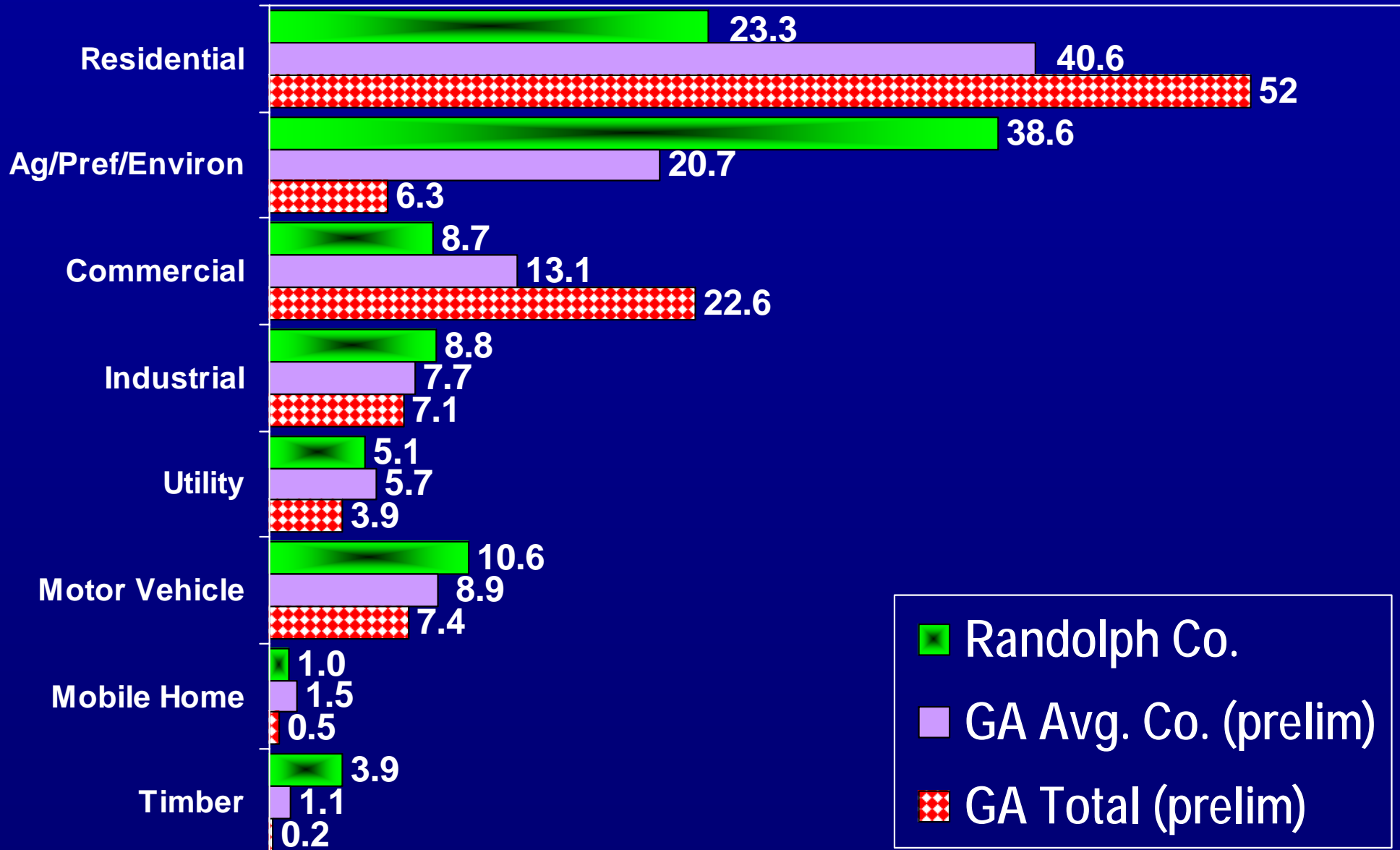
Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group: 2004

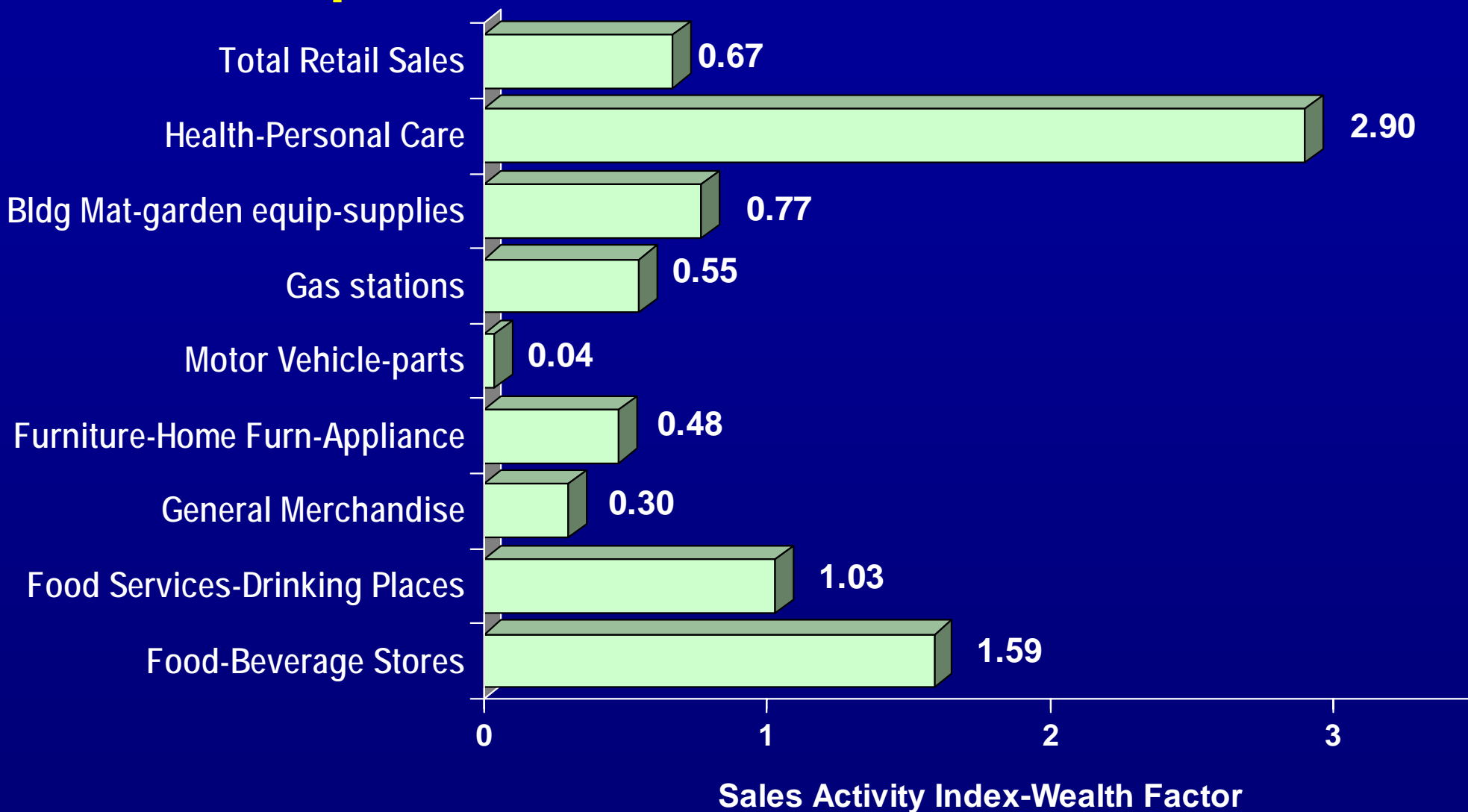

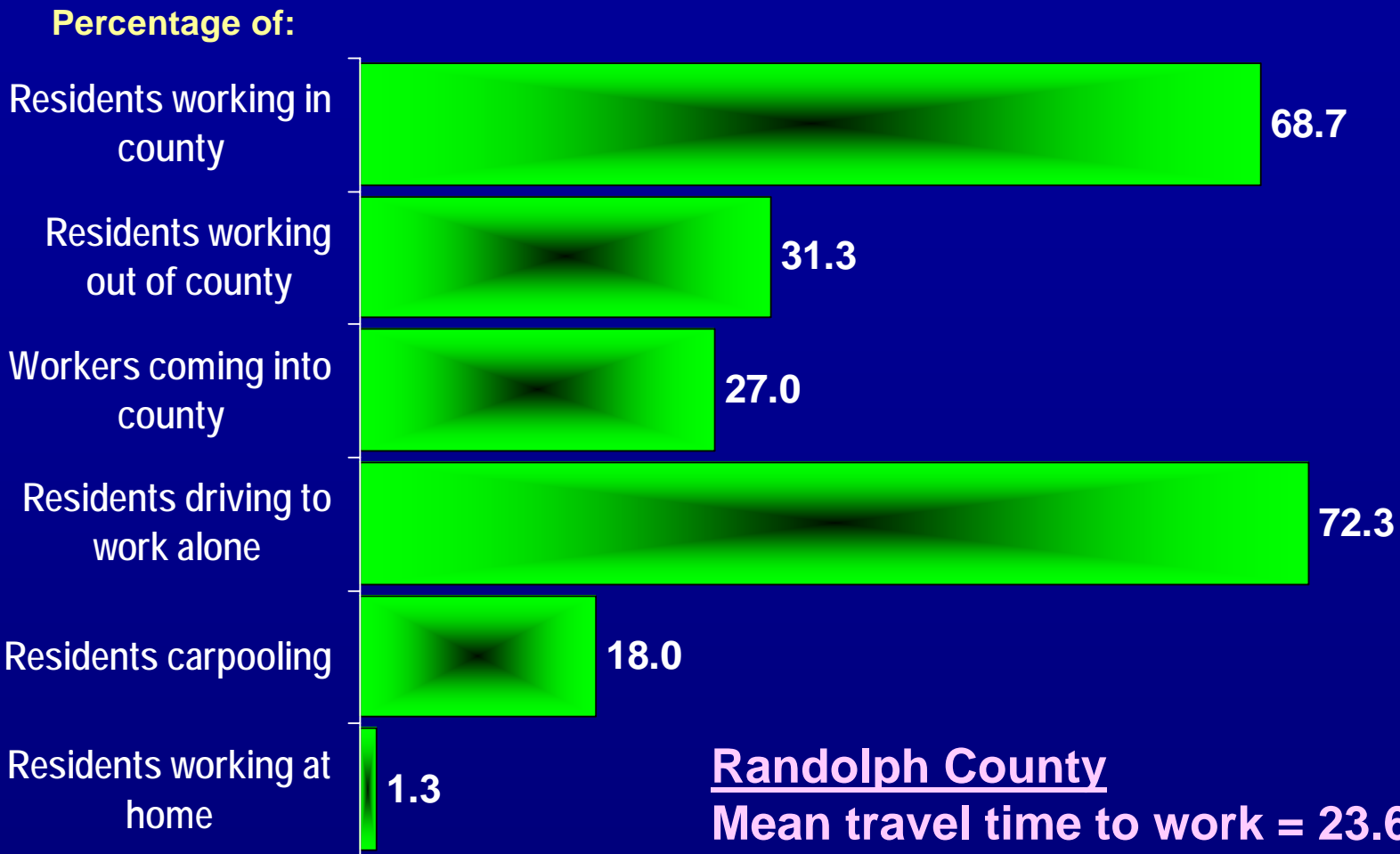
Retail Sales Analysis: 2004

Randolph Co. Total Retail Sales = \$36,196,000
