

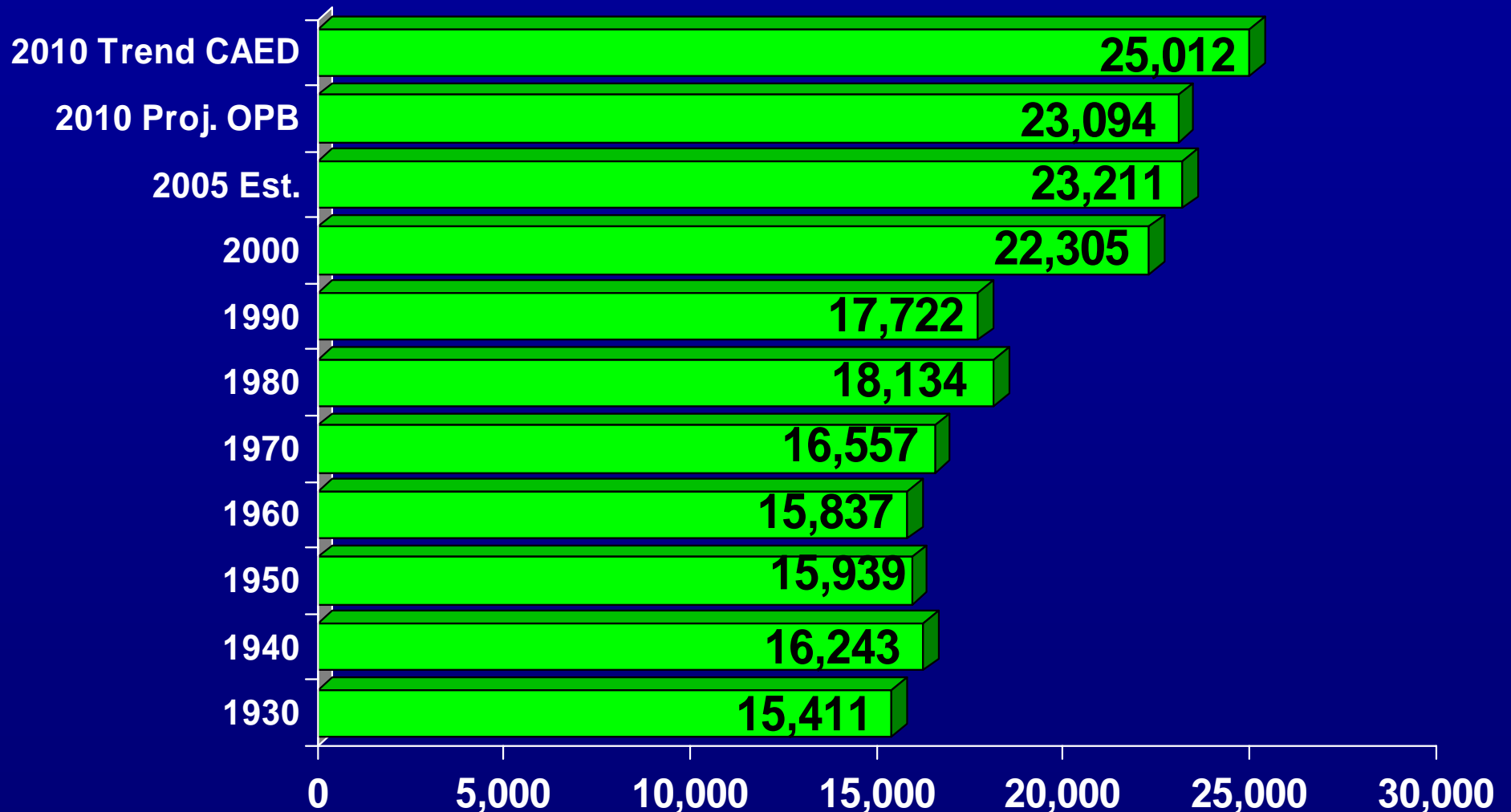

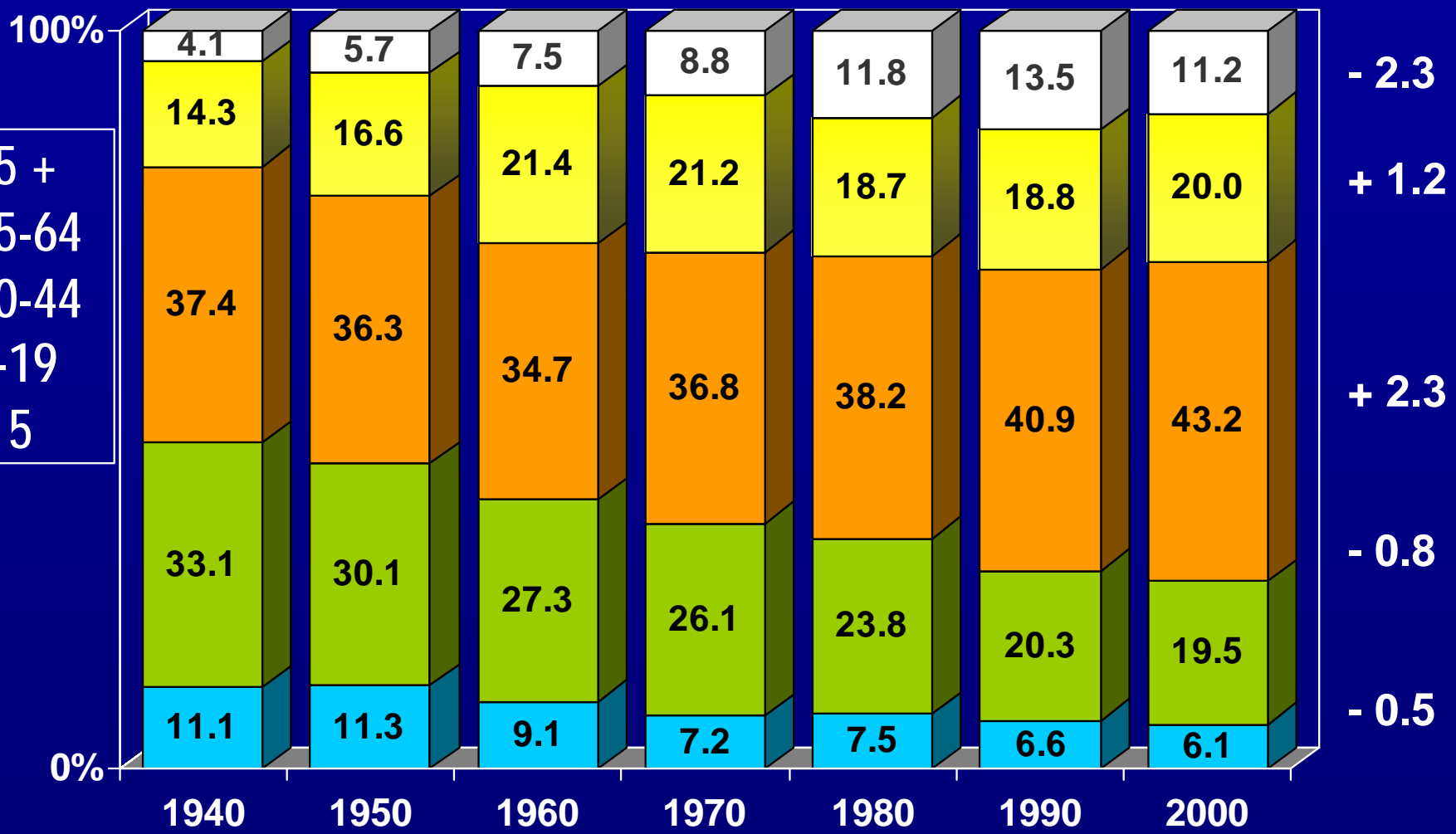
Total Population Tattnall County

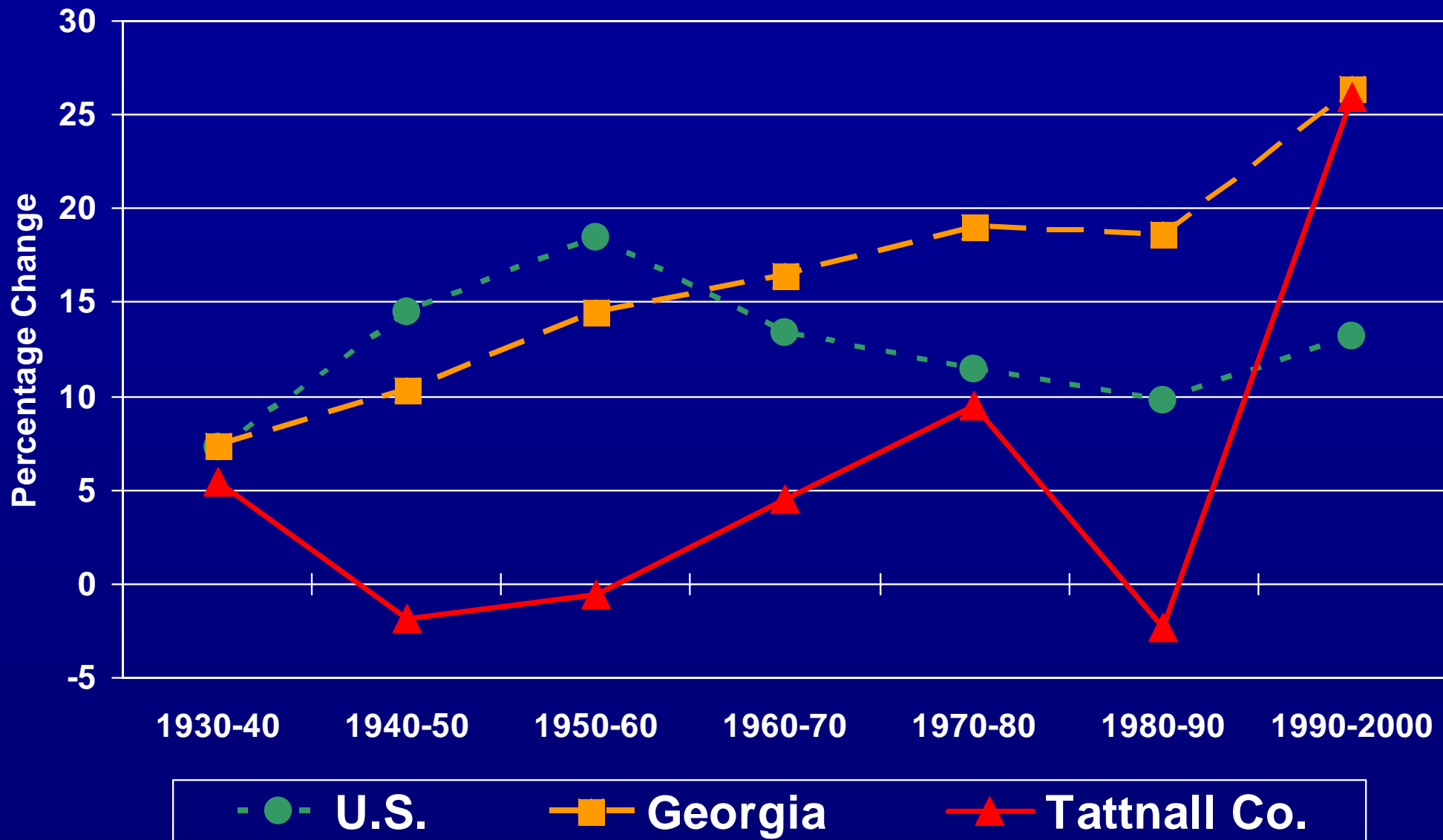

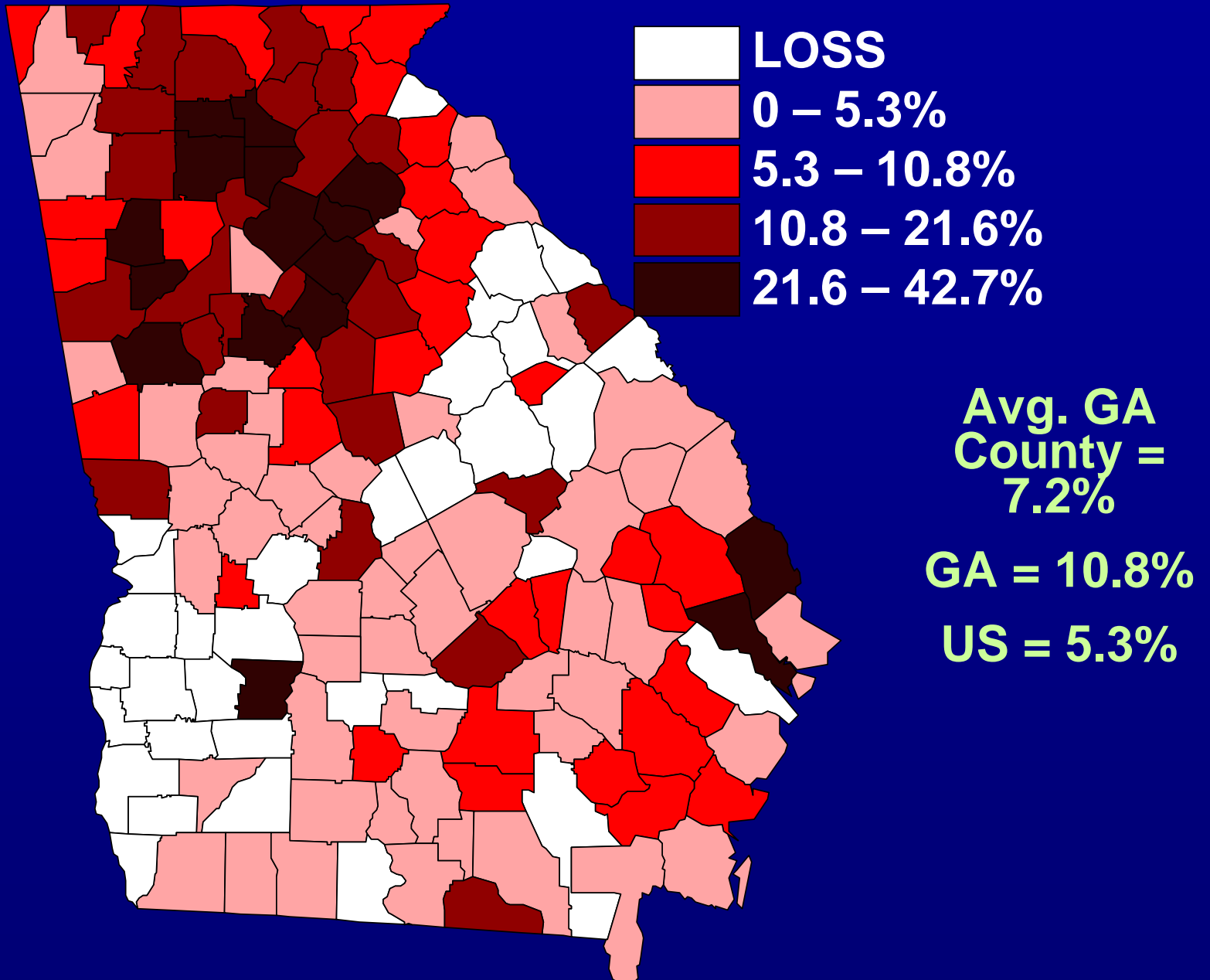

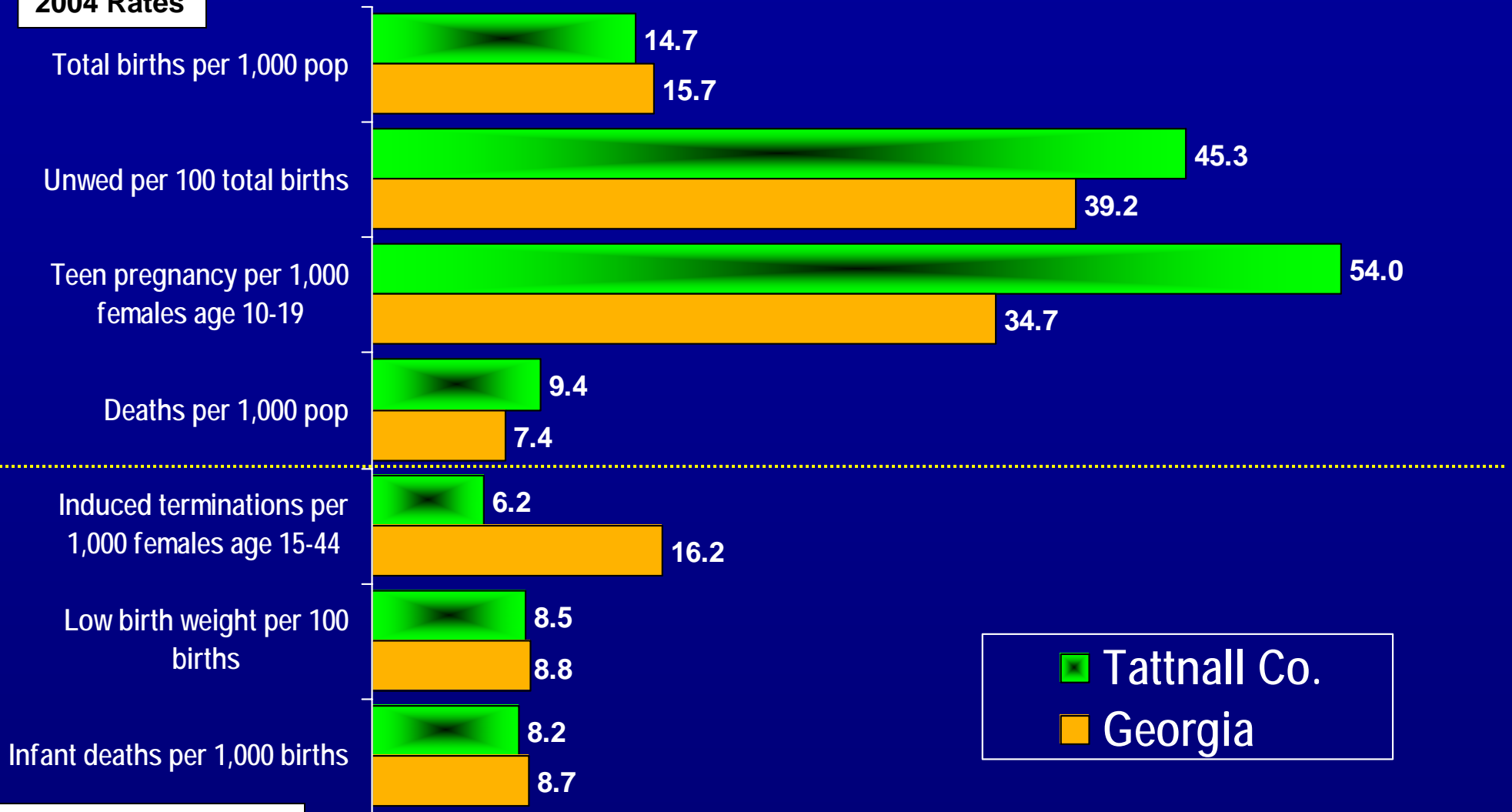

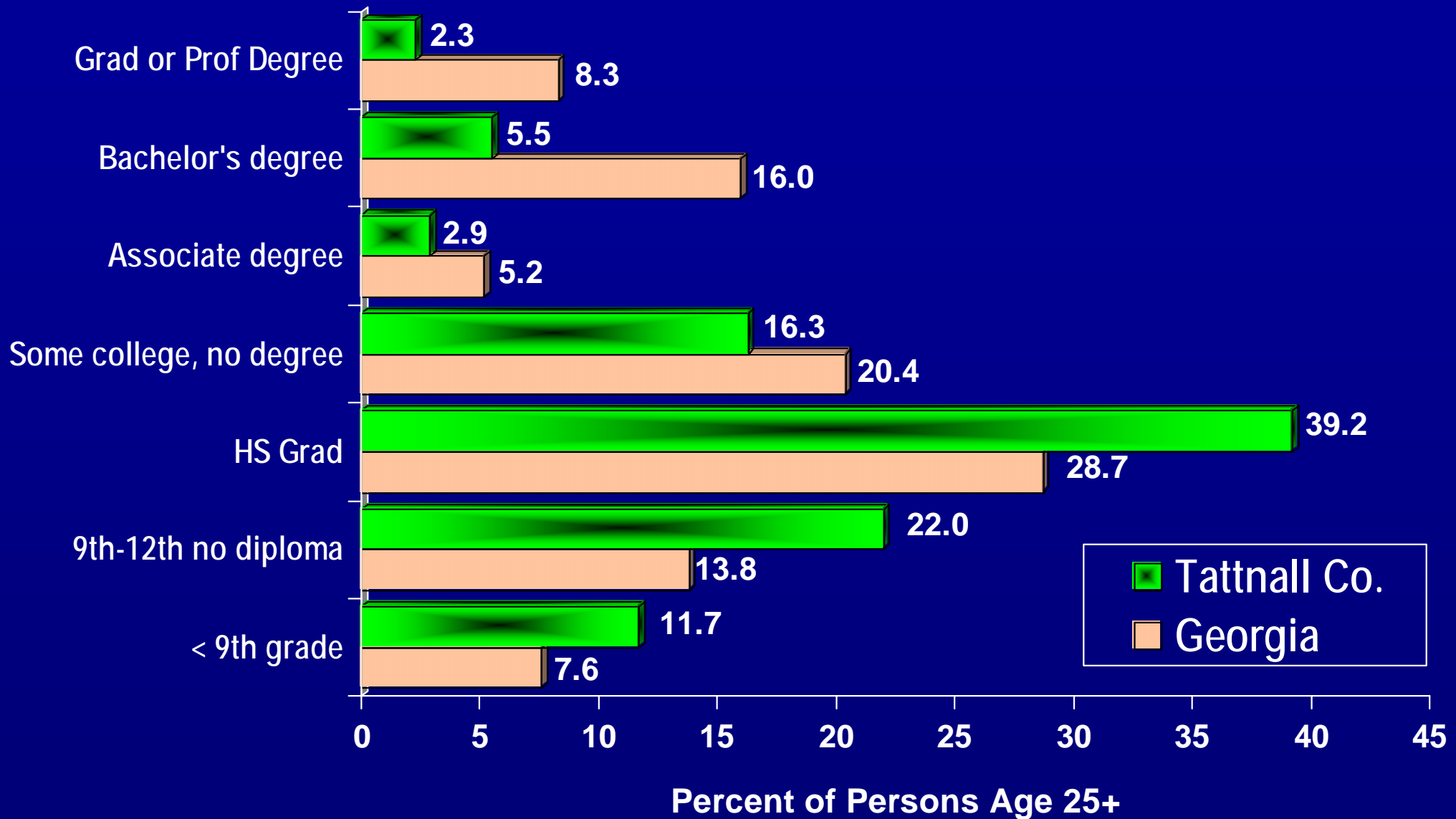

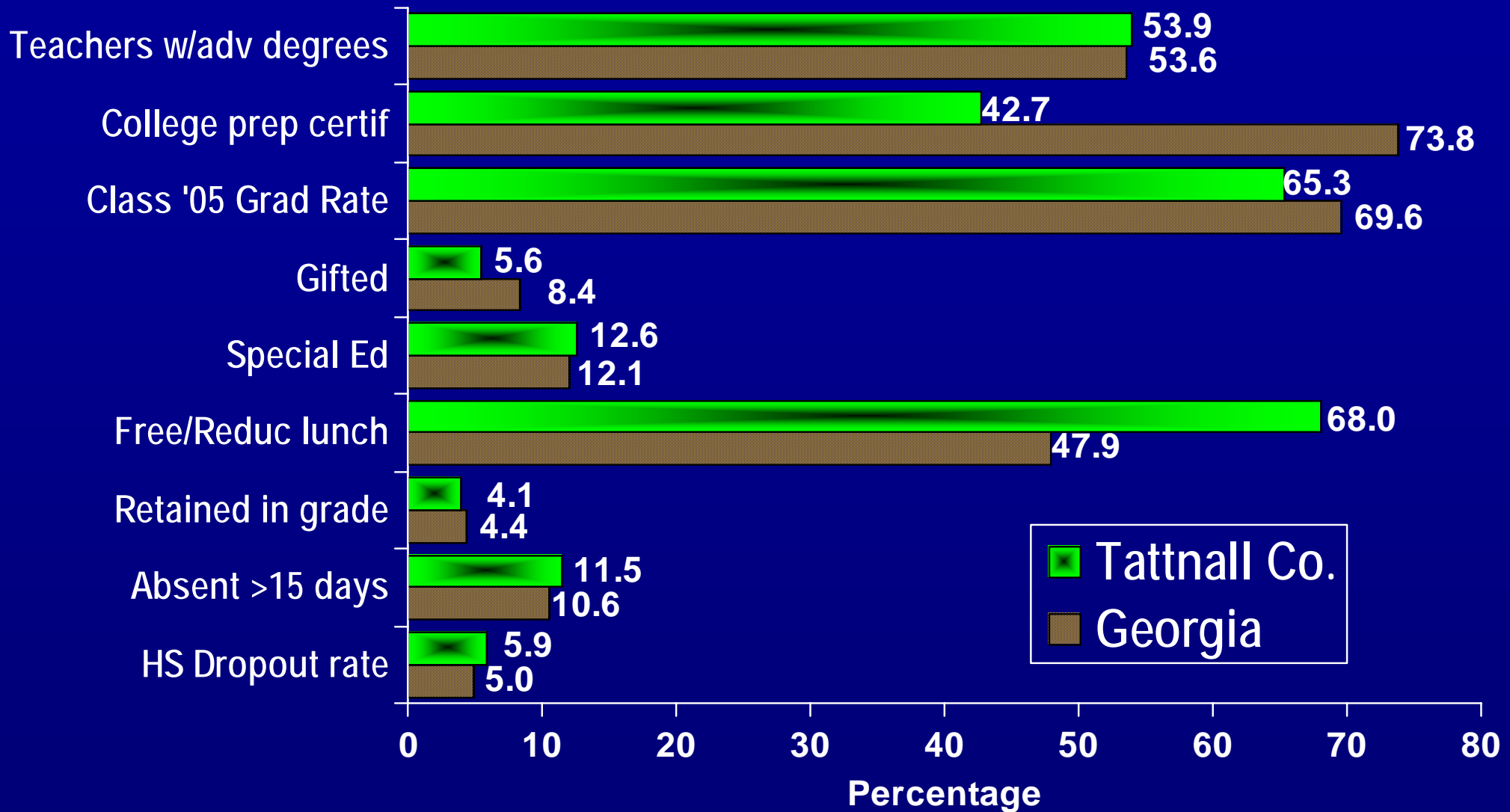

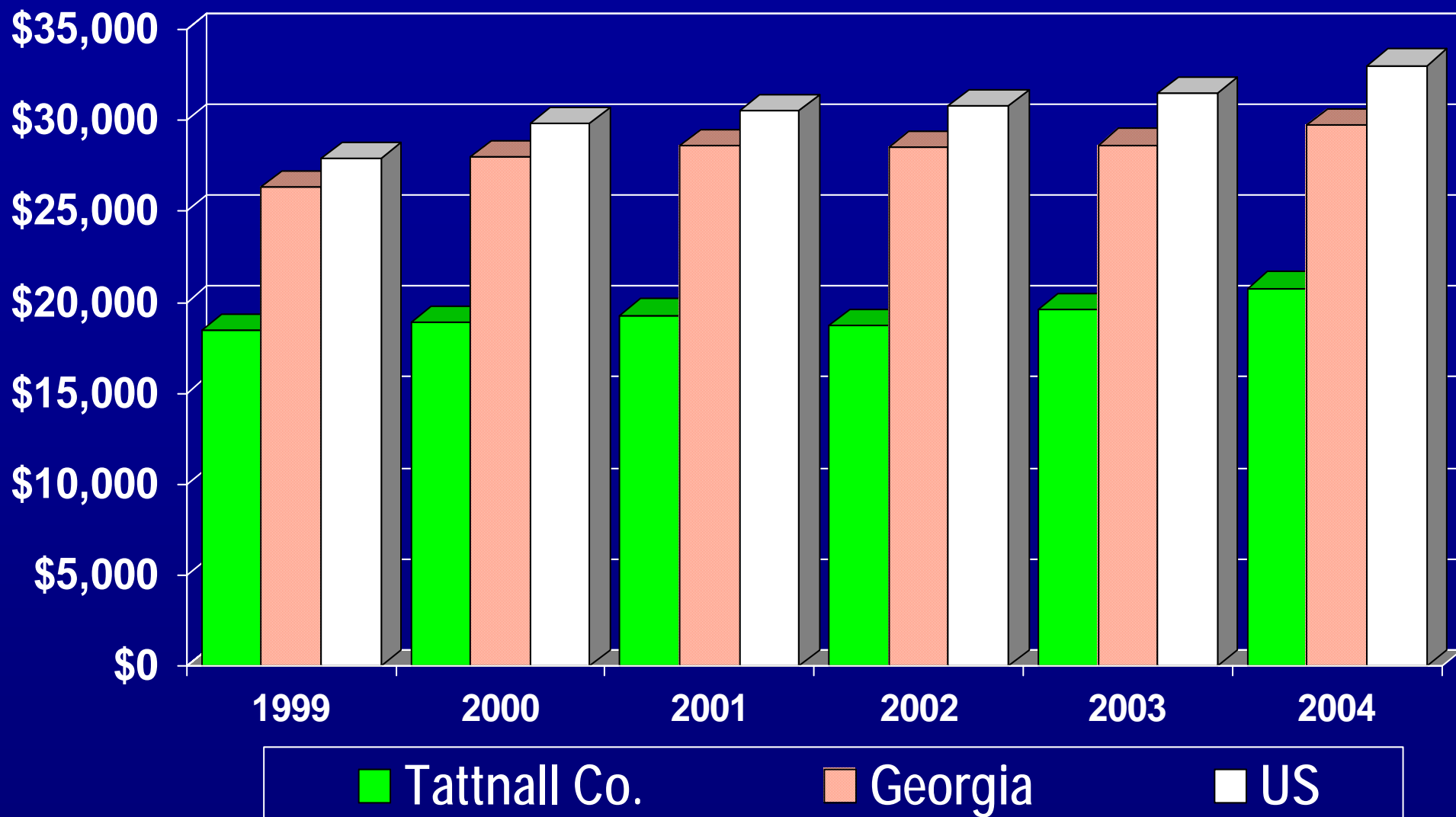

Per Capita Income: 1999-2004

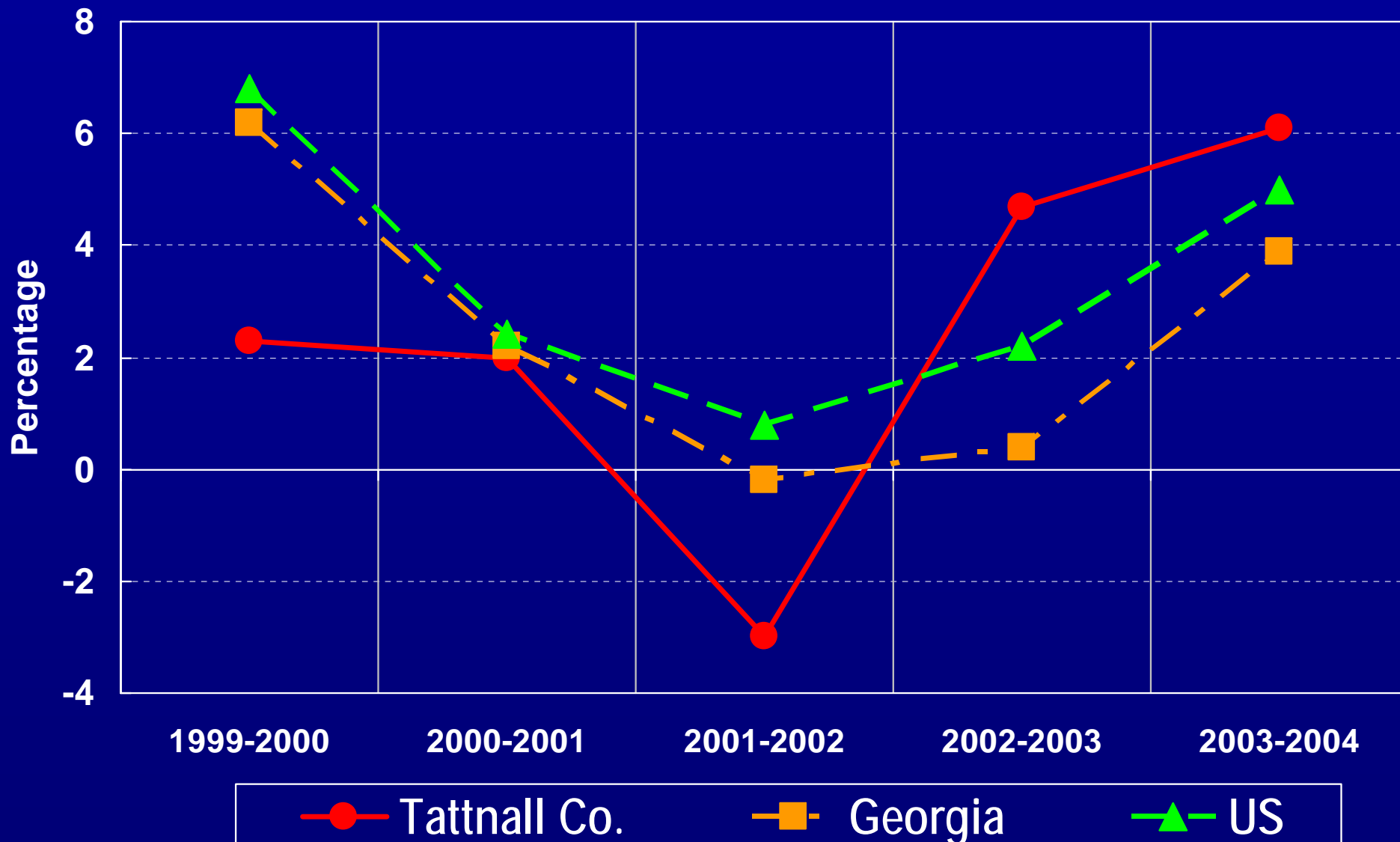

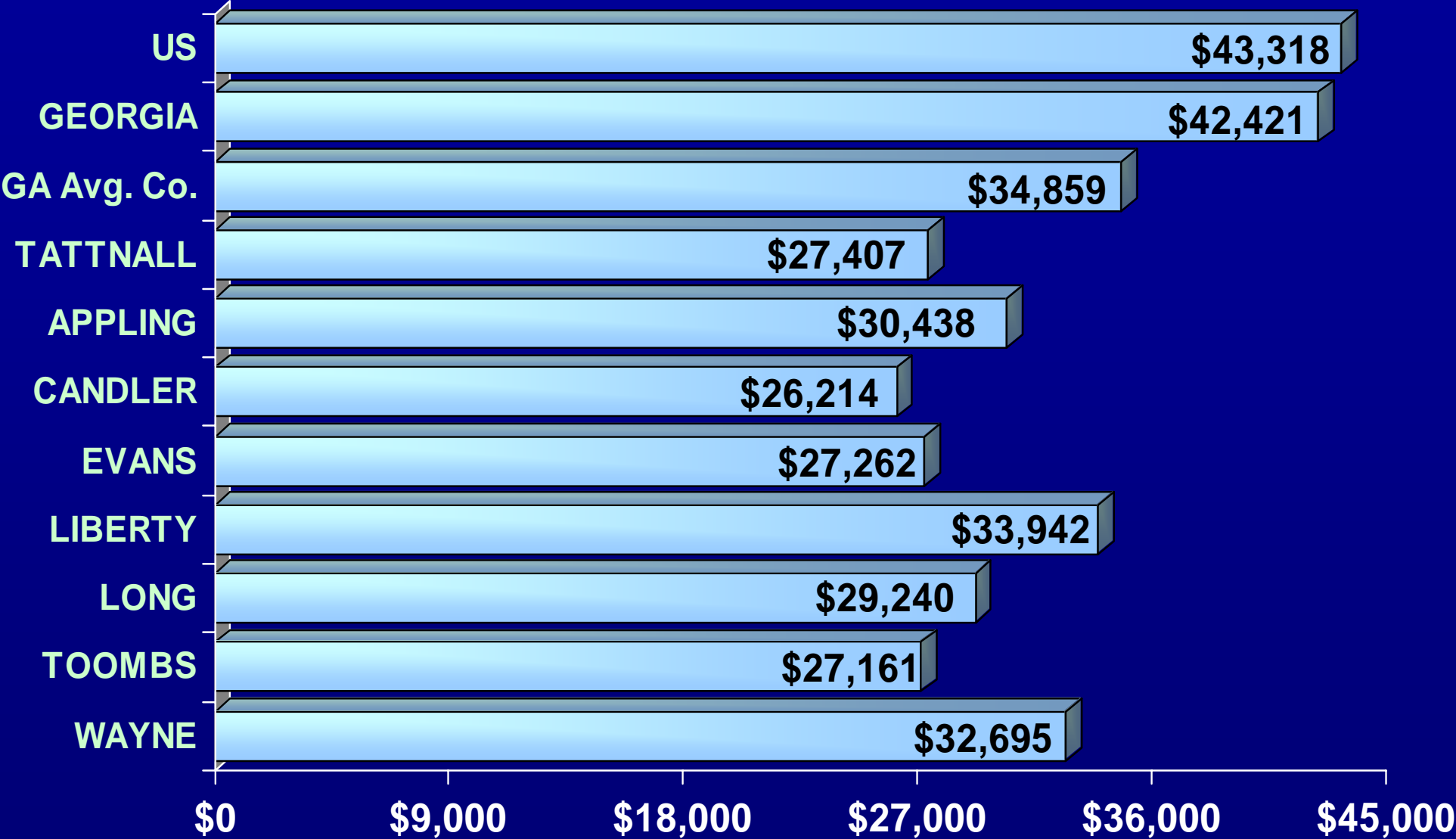

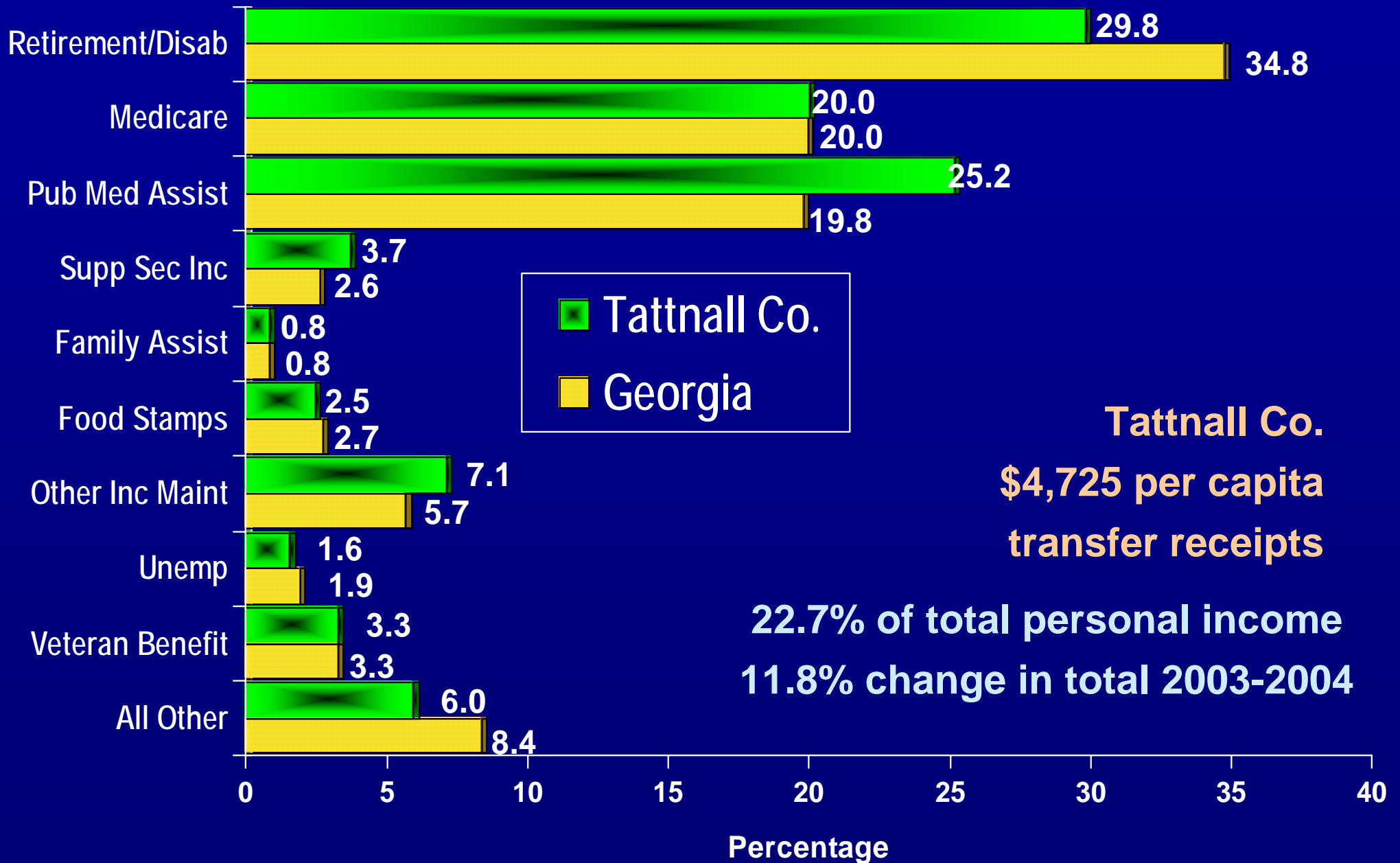

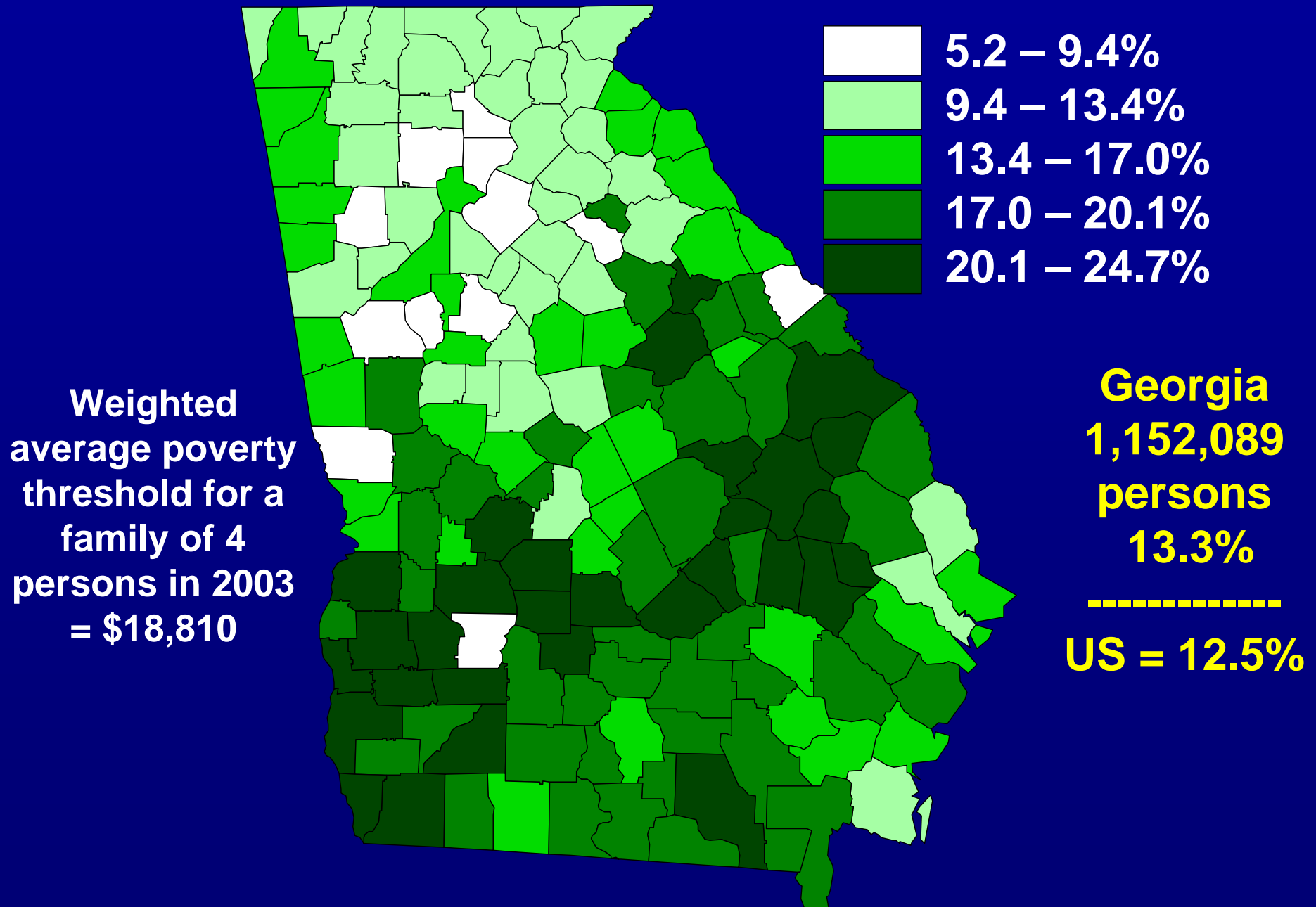

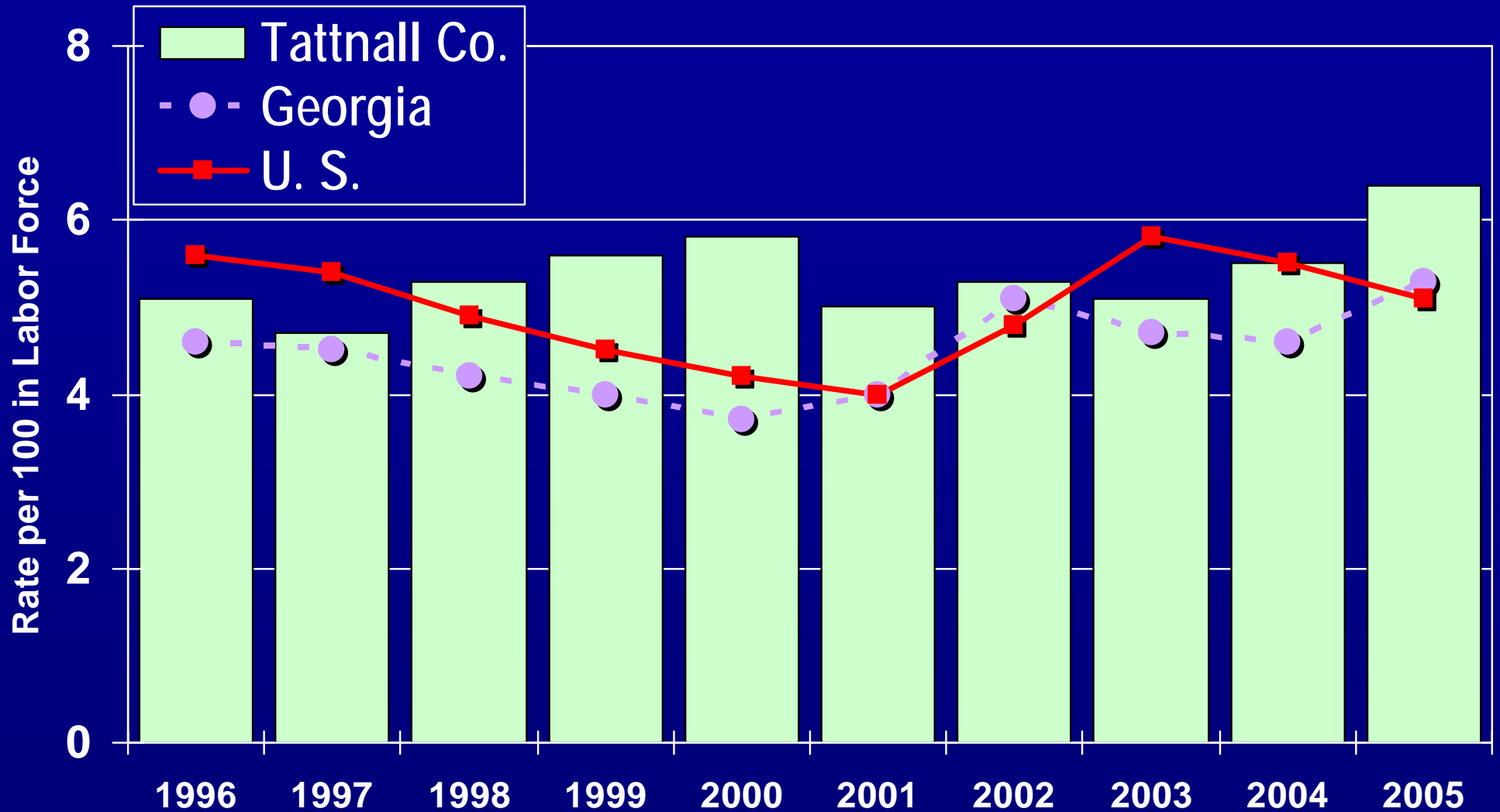

Unemployment Rates



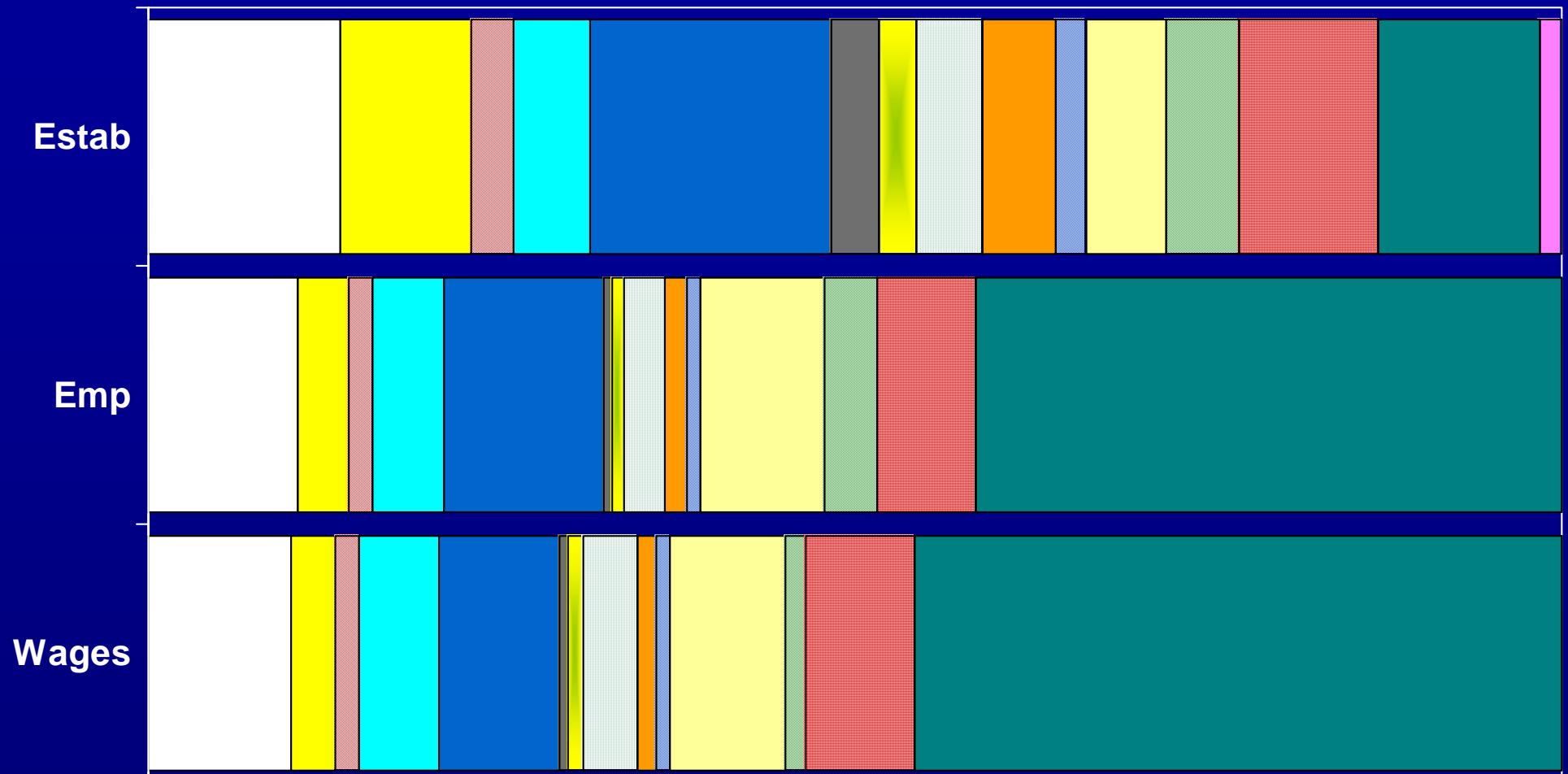

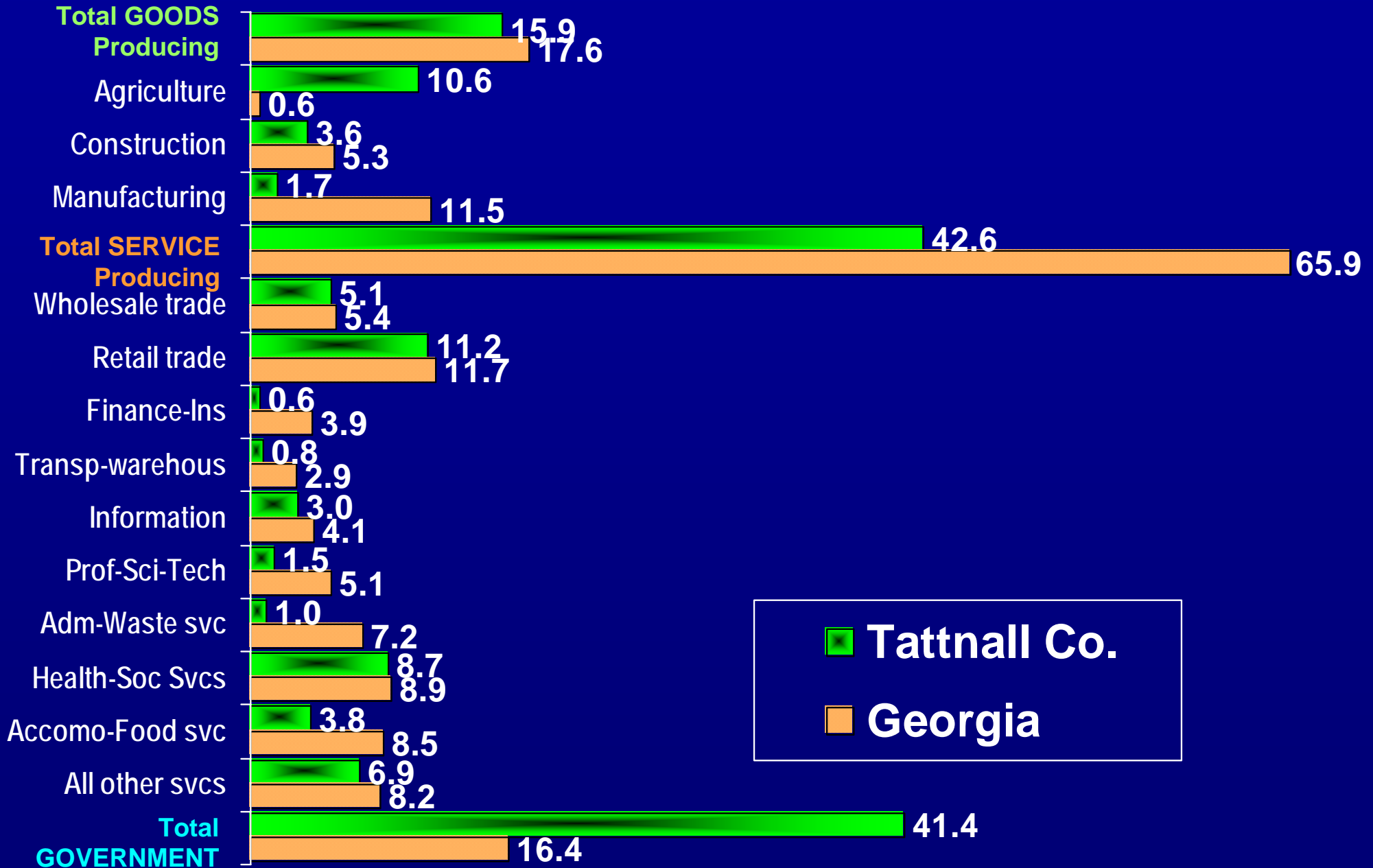

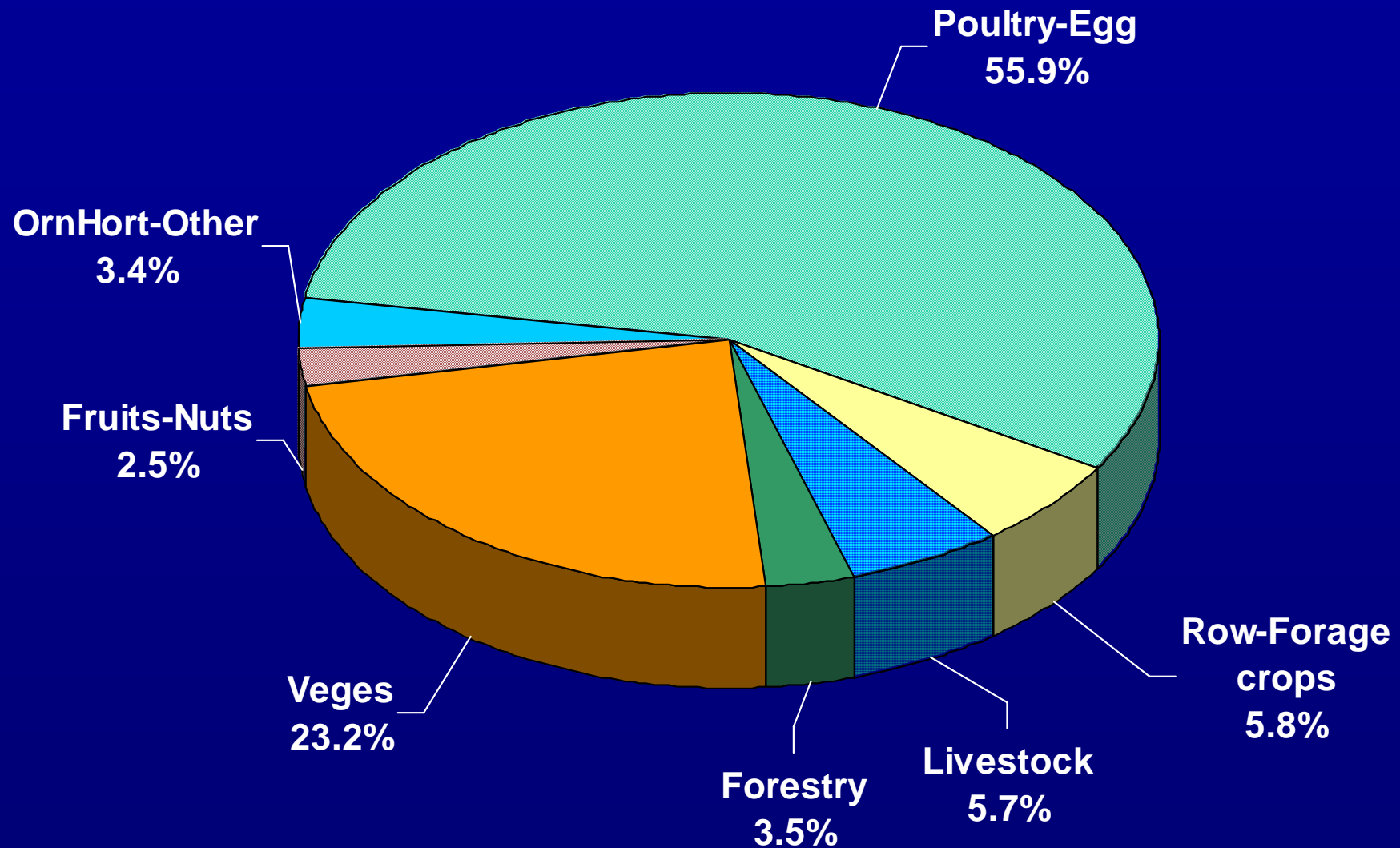
Employment Comparisons by Industry: 2005

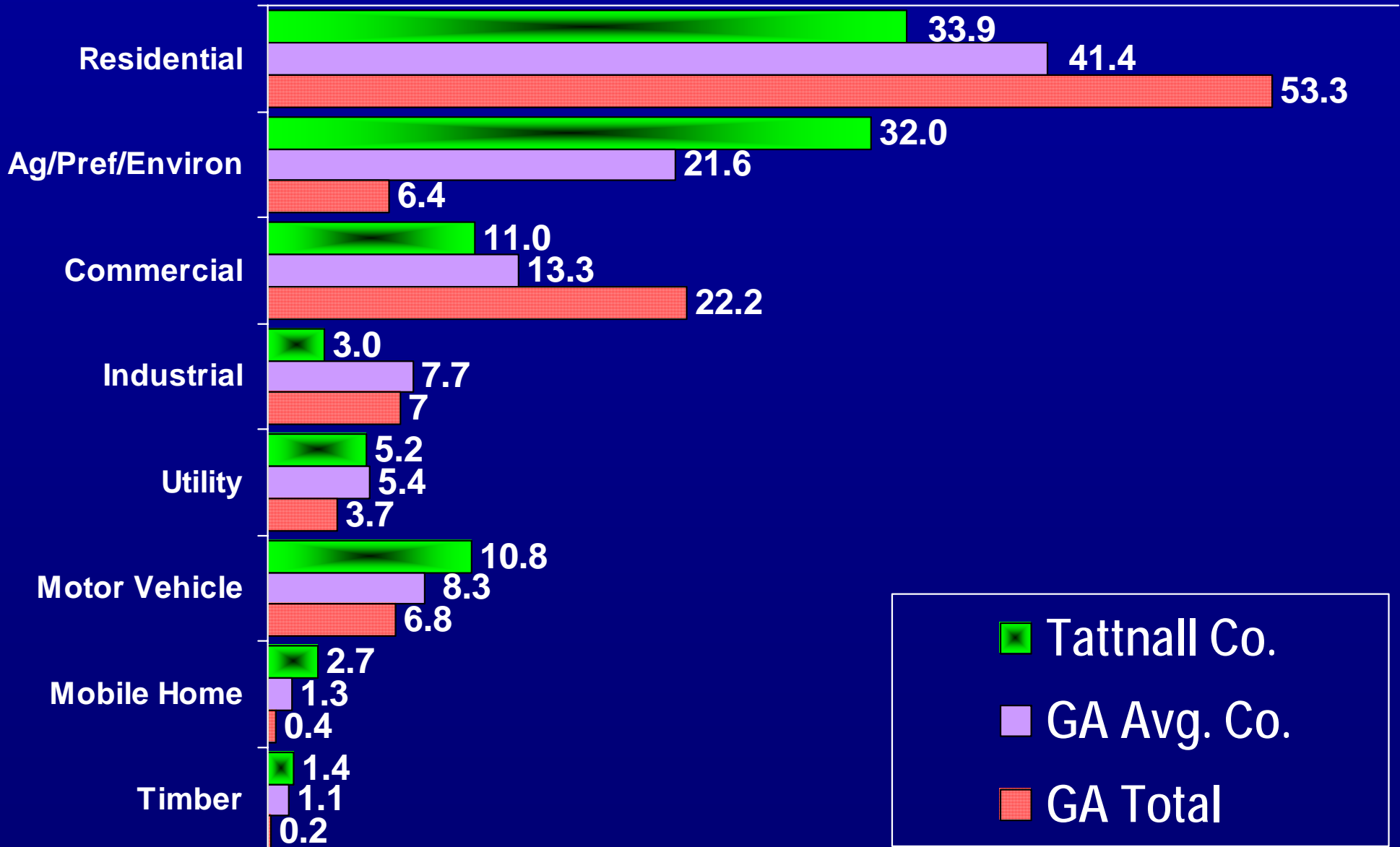
Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group: 2005

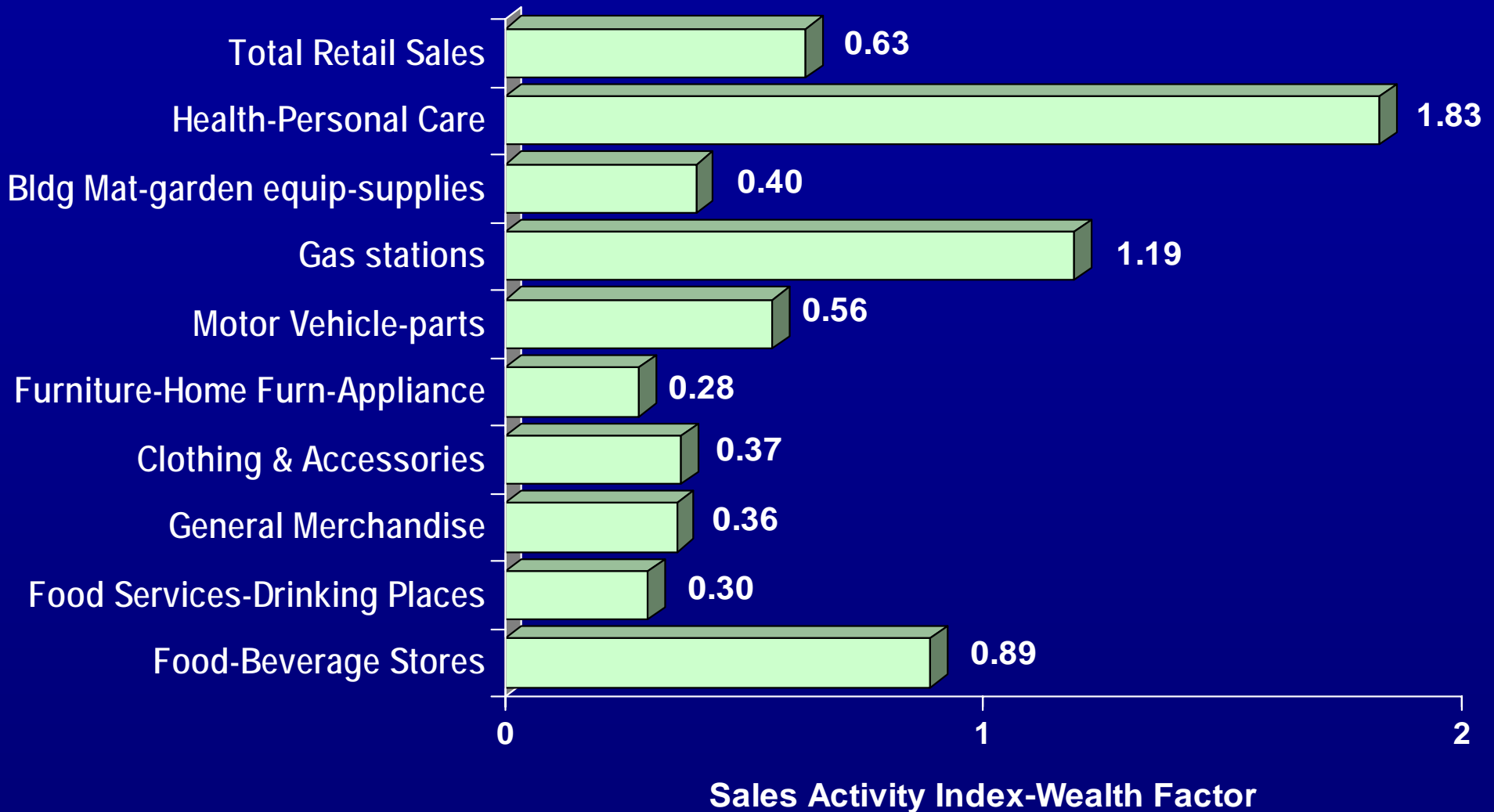

Tattnall Co. Total Retail Sales = \$135,307,000

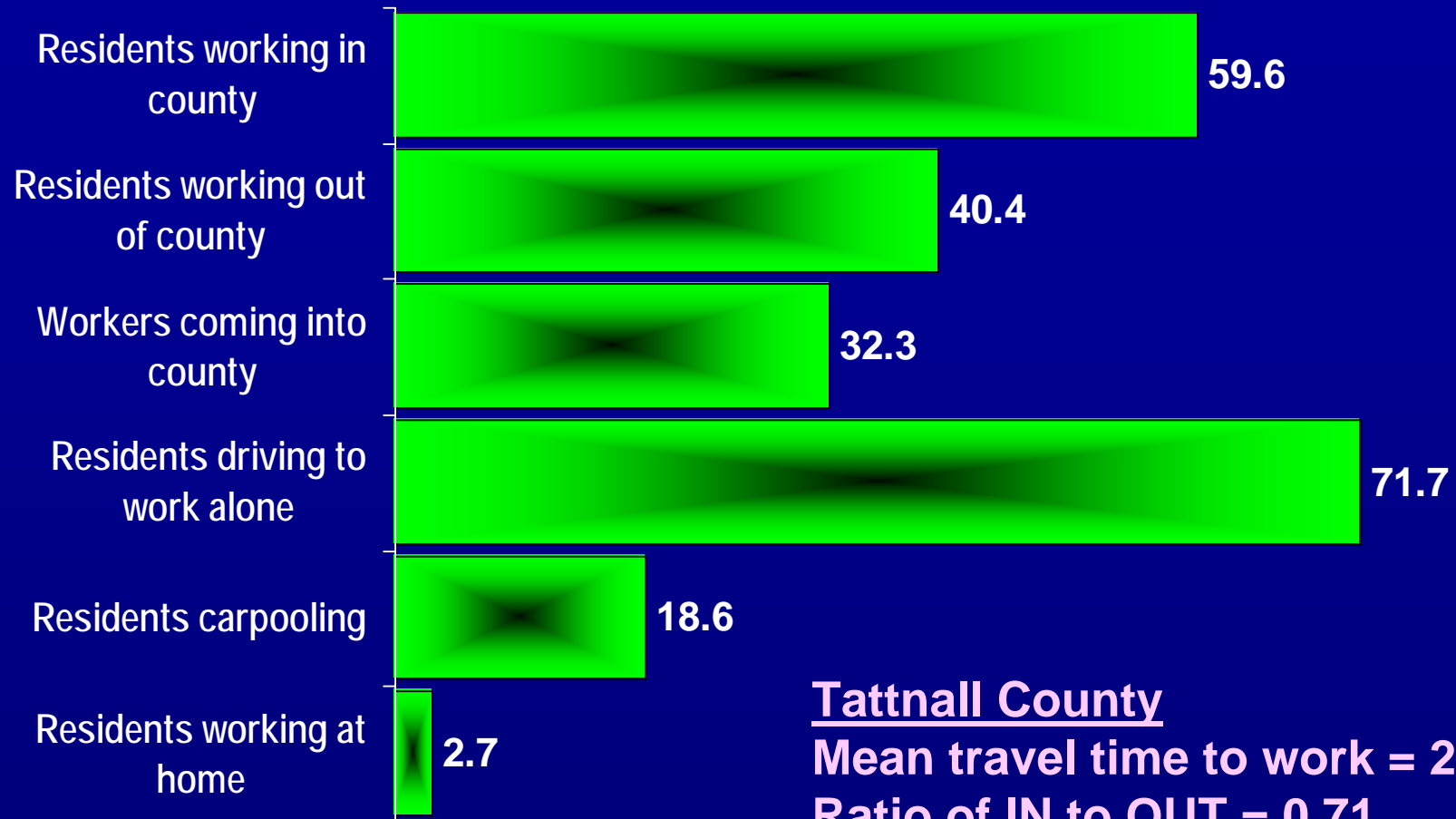


A “pull factor” of 1.0 means that the county’s sales are what would be expected based upon the number of residents and their relative wealth.
