

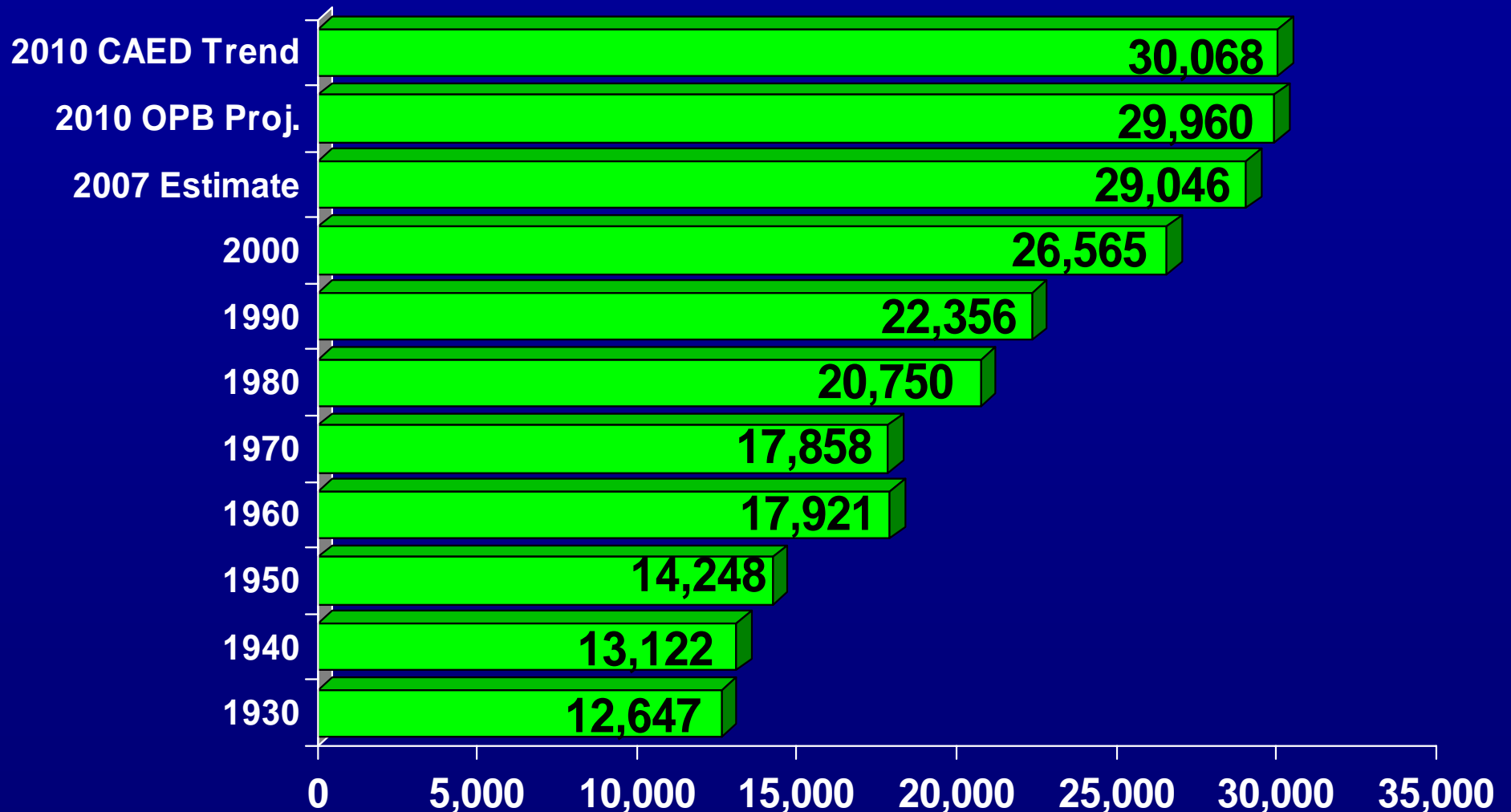

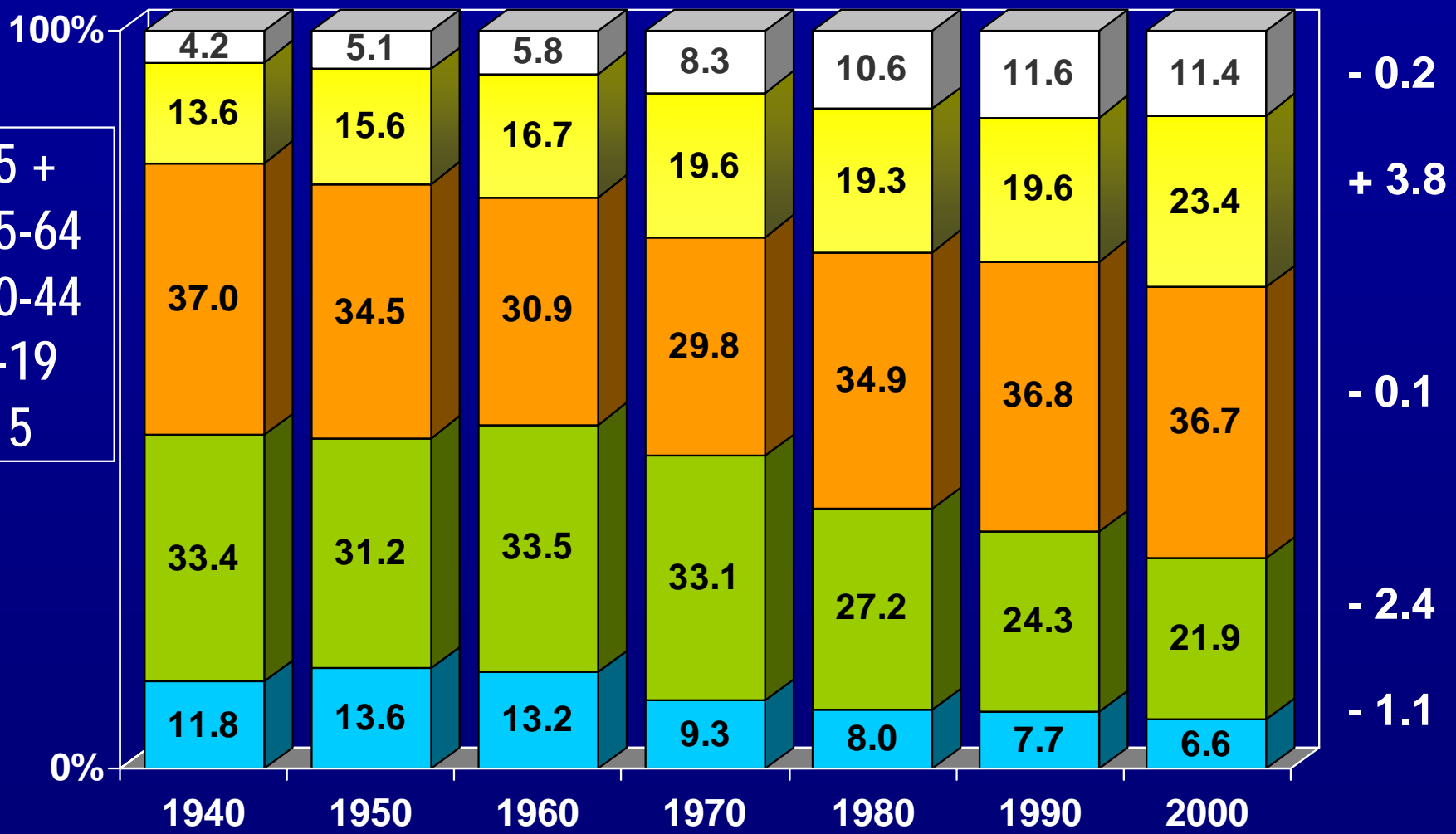
# Total Population Wayne County

2007 Estimated Median Age

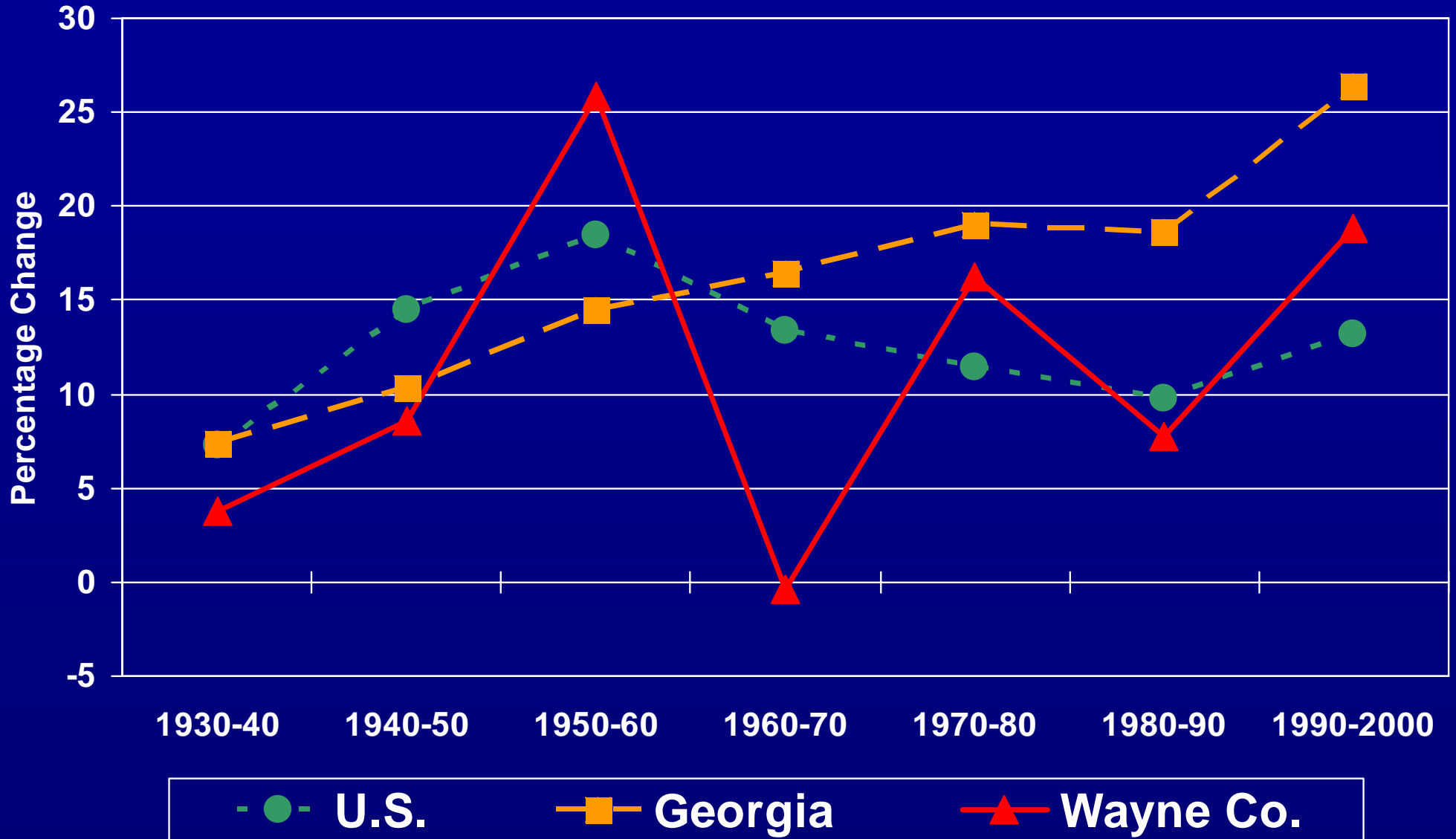

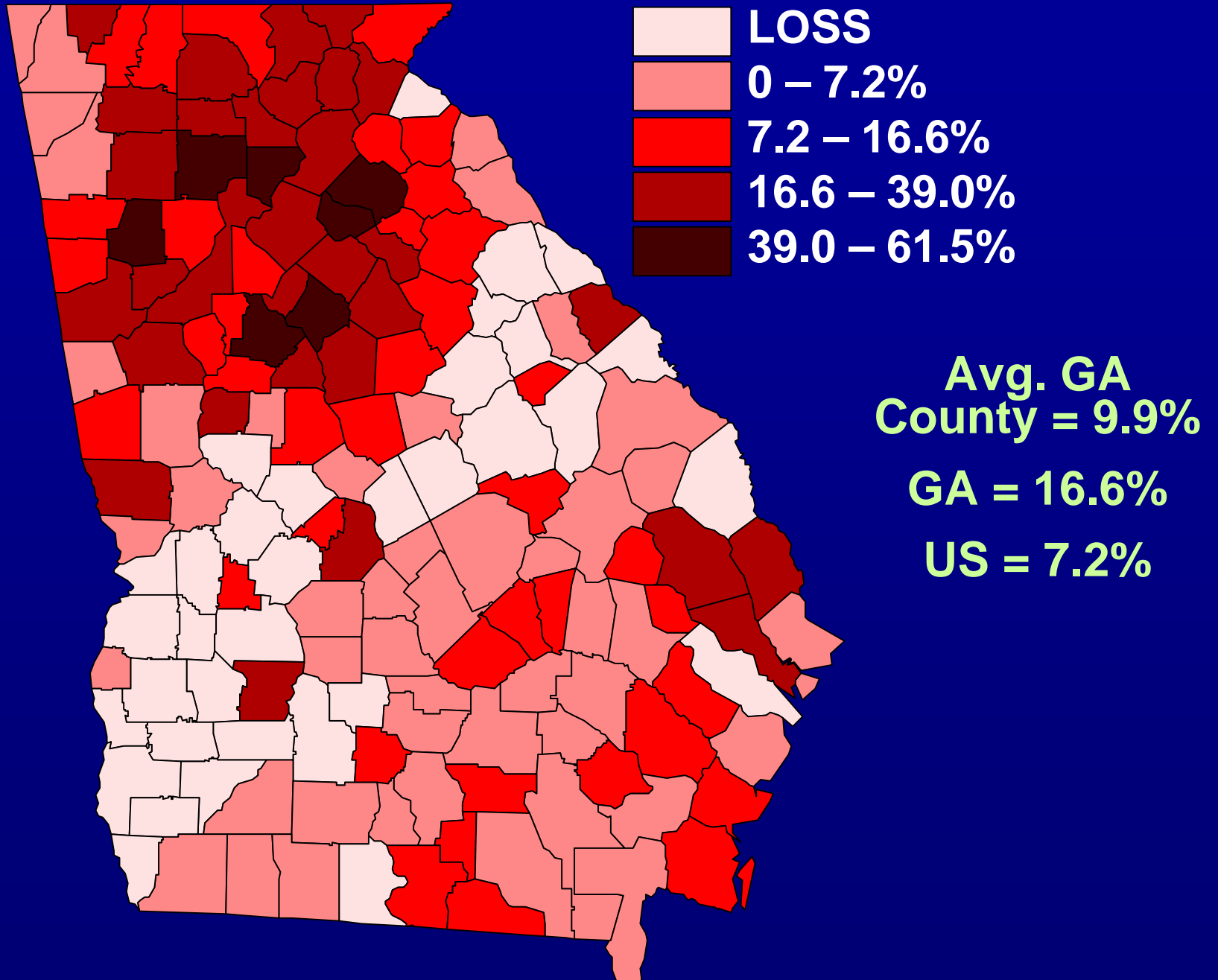

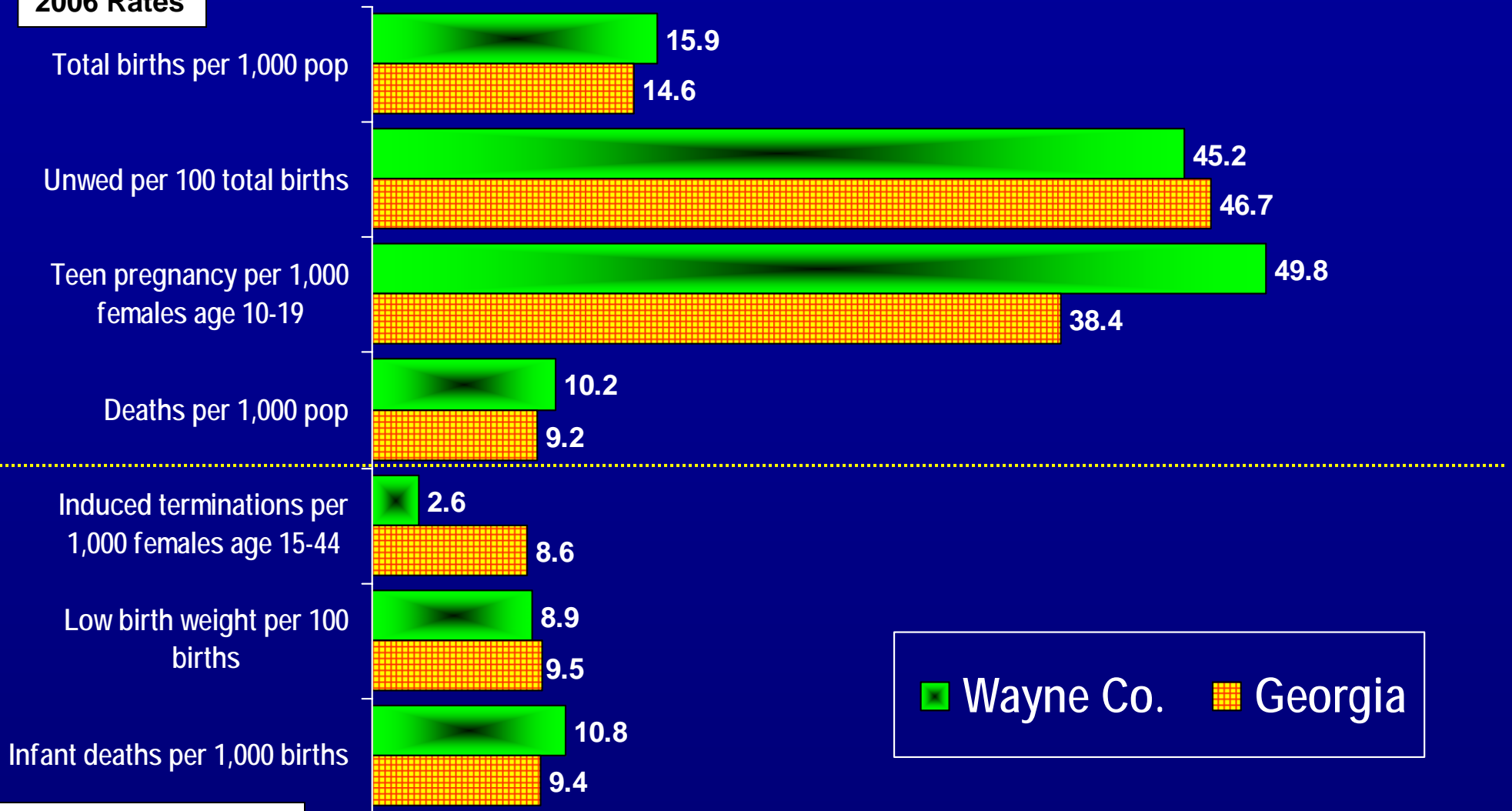

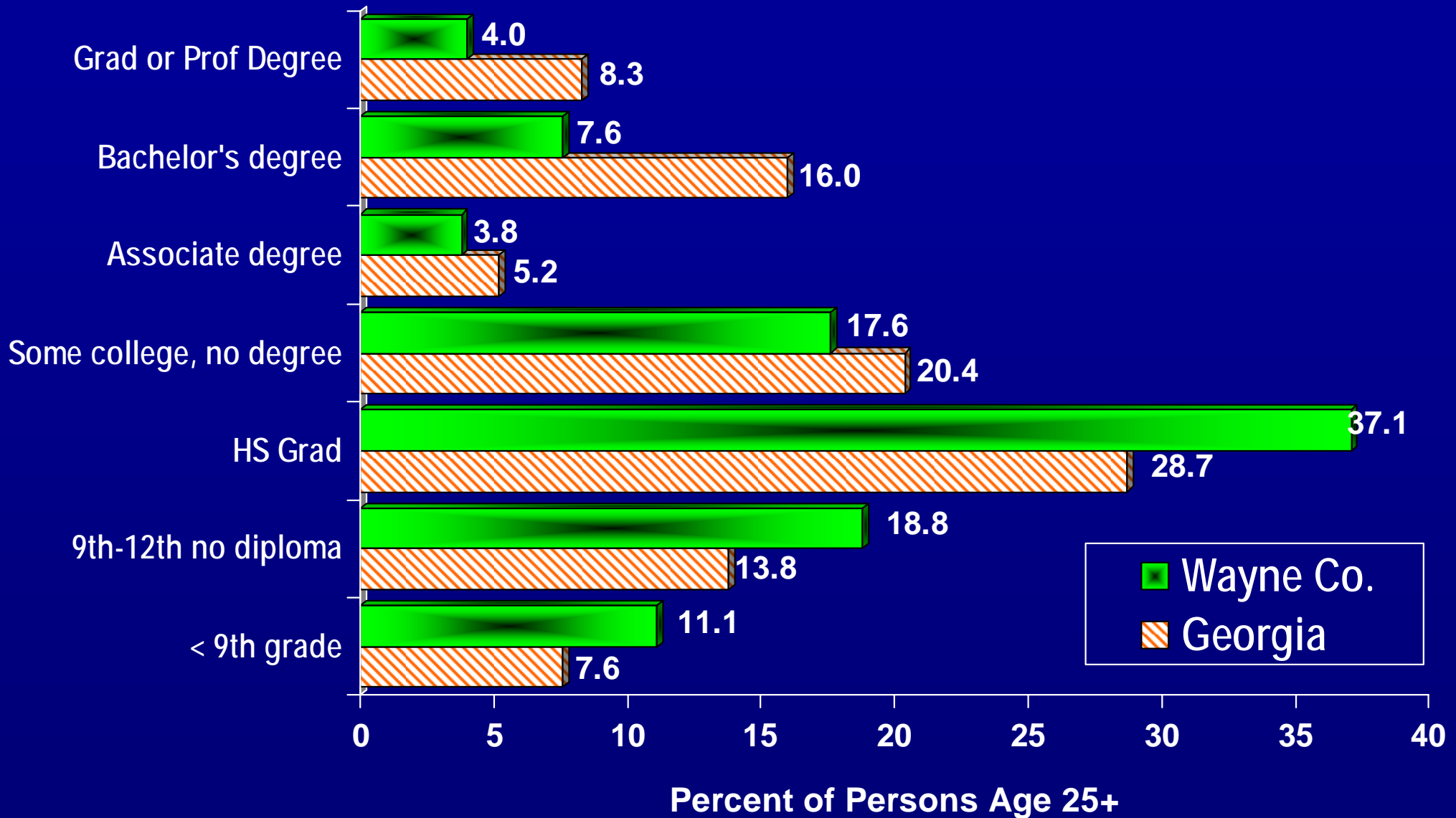

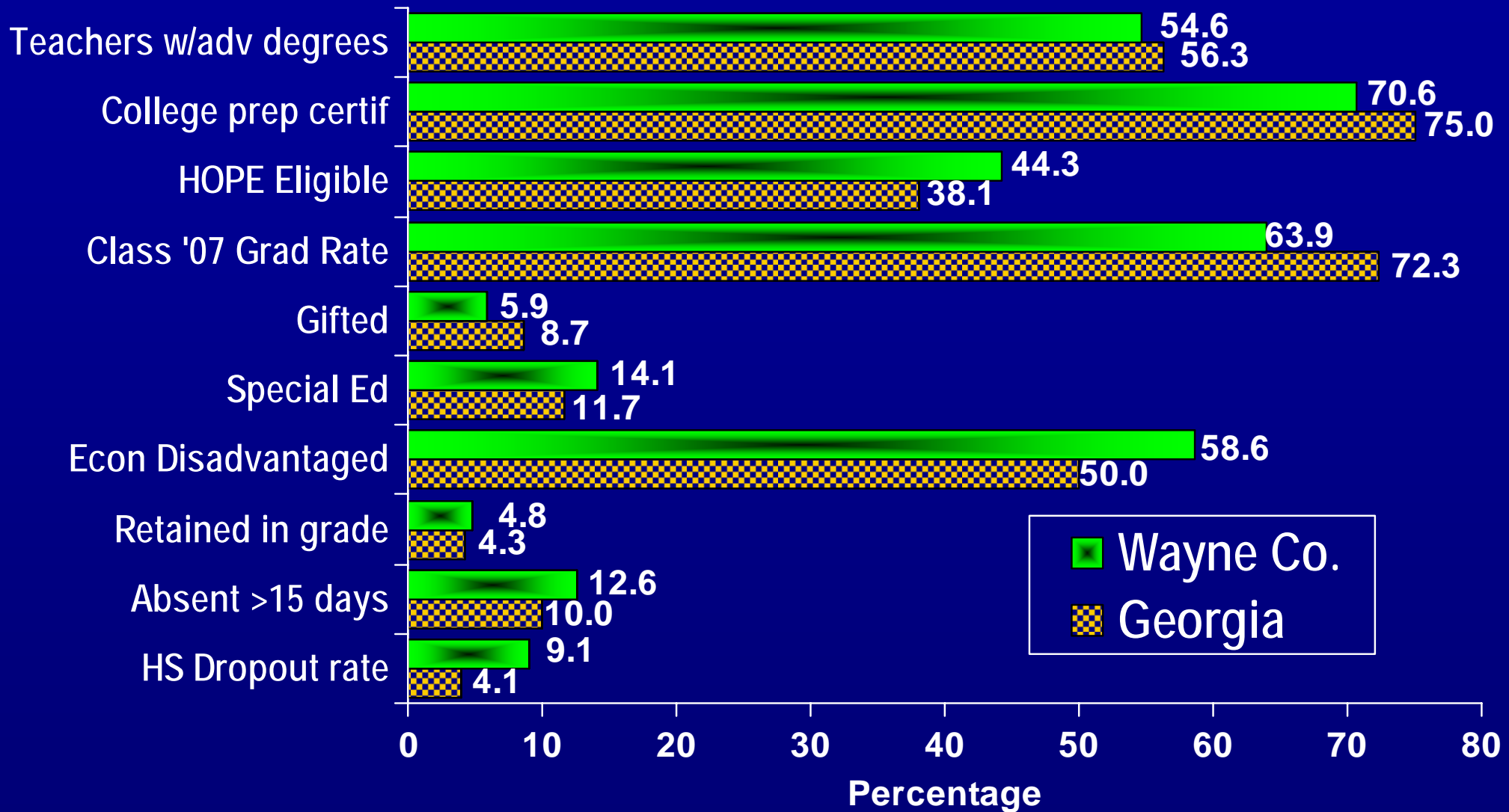

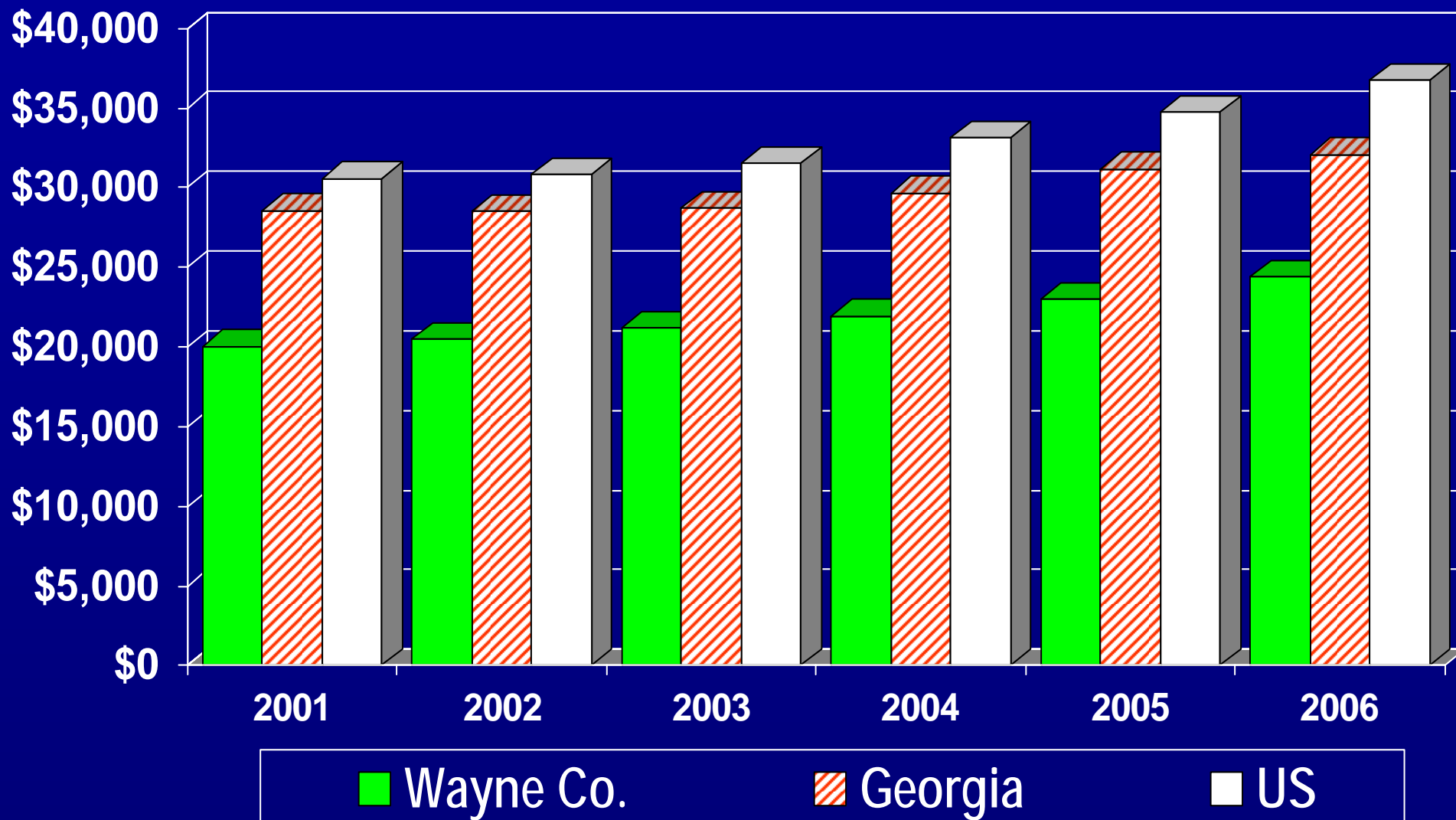

# Per Capita Income: 2001-2006

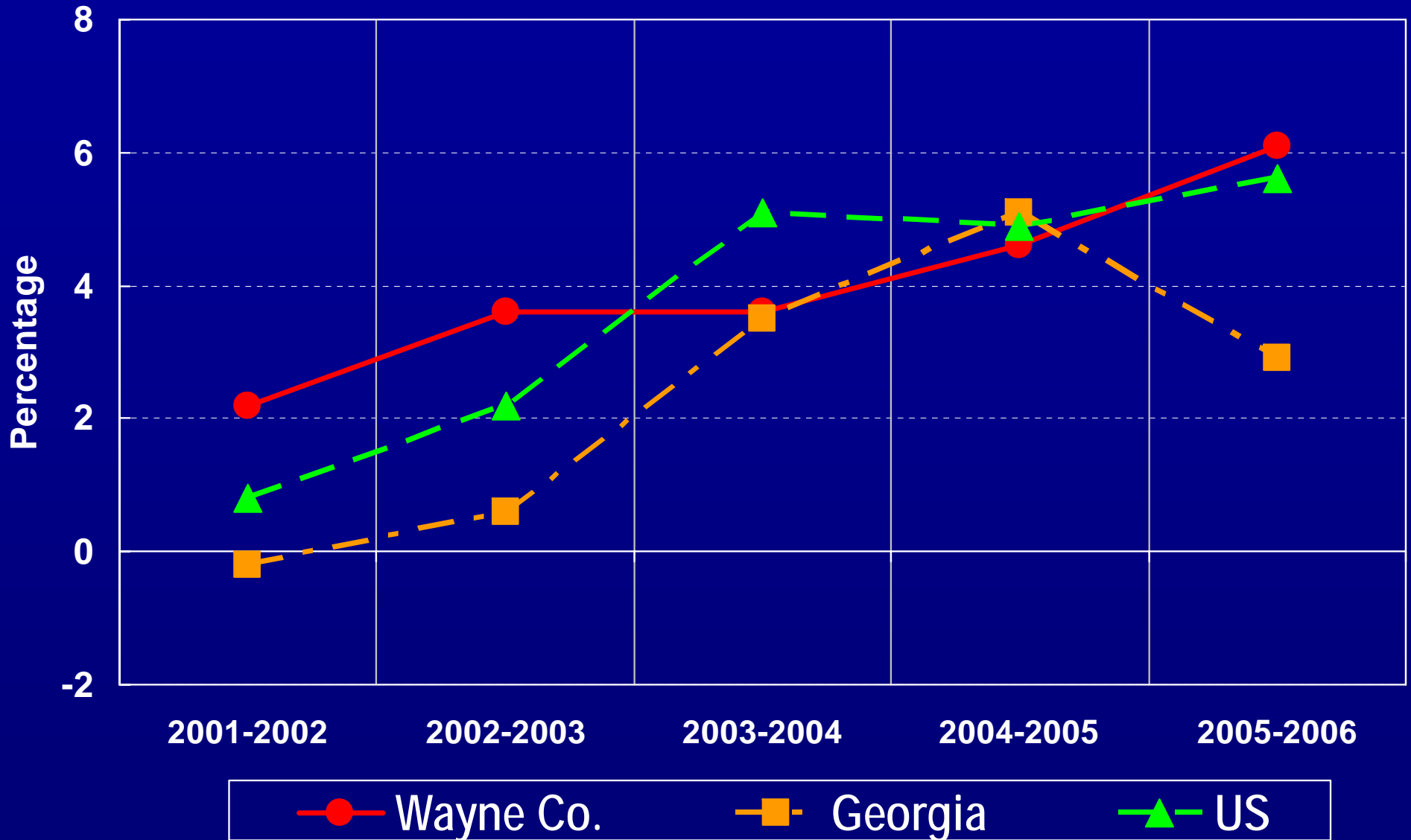

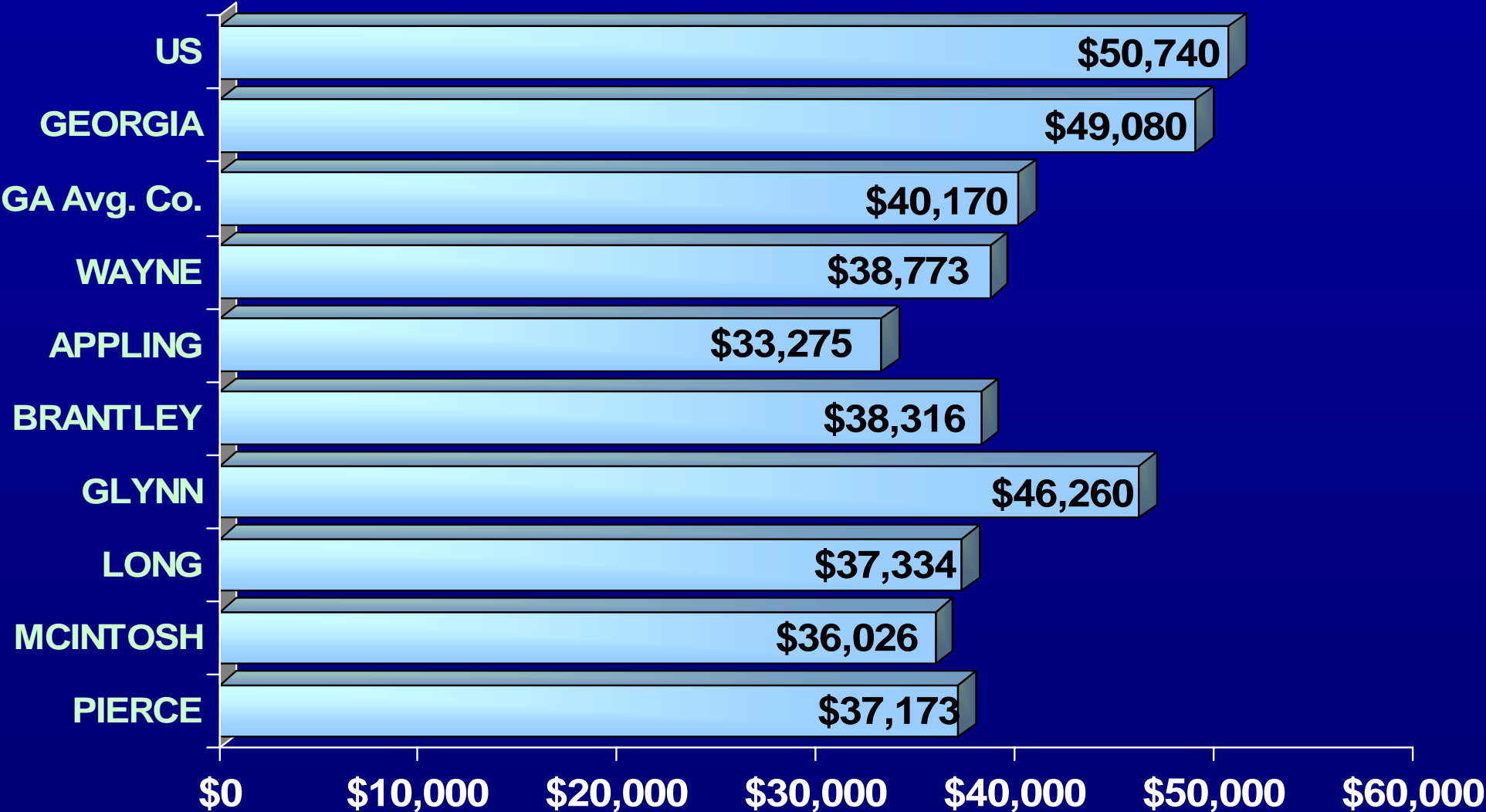

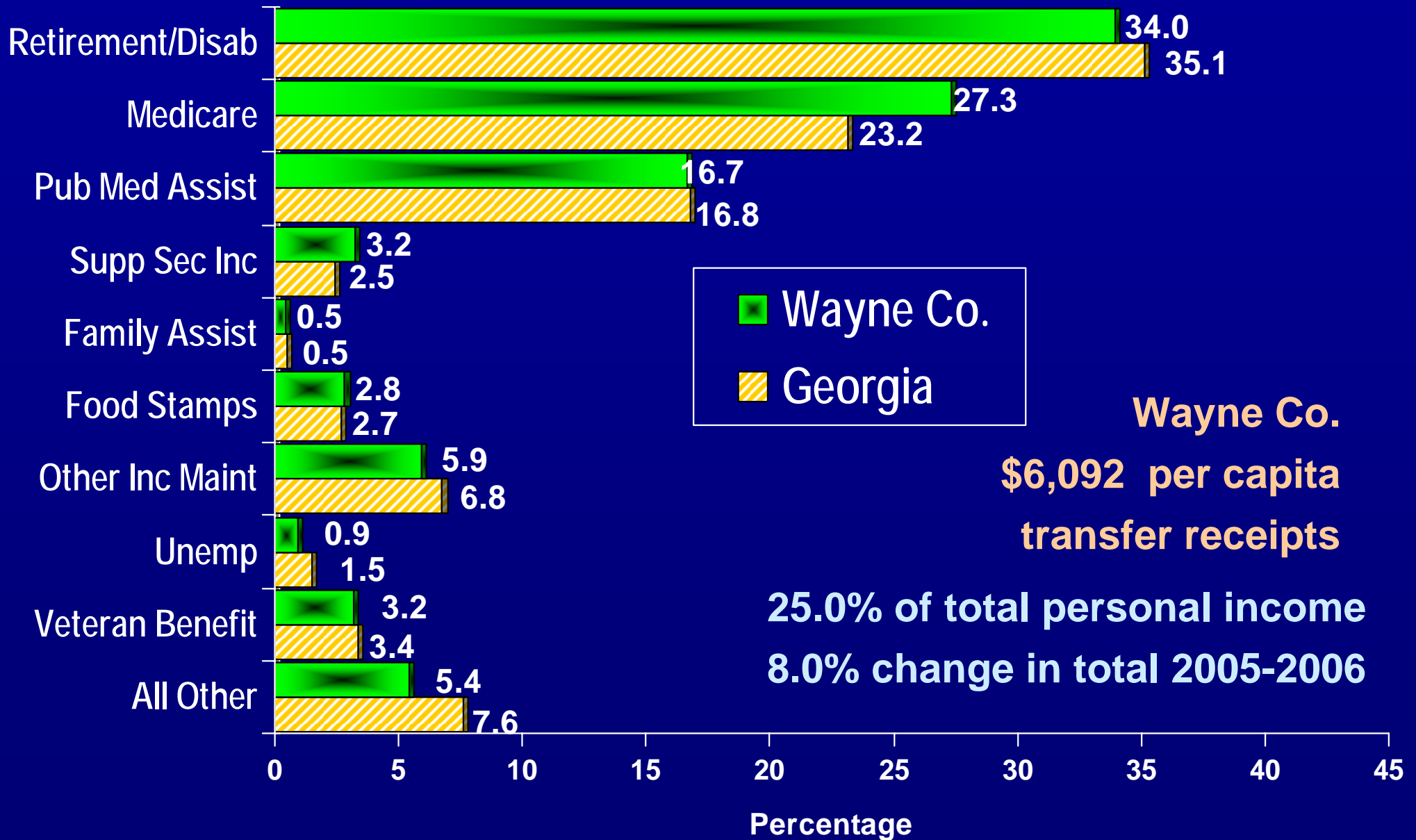

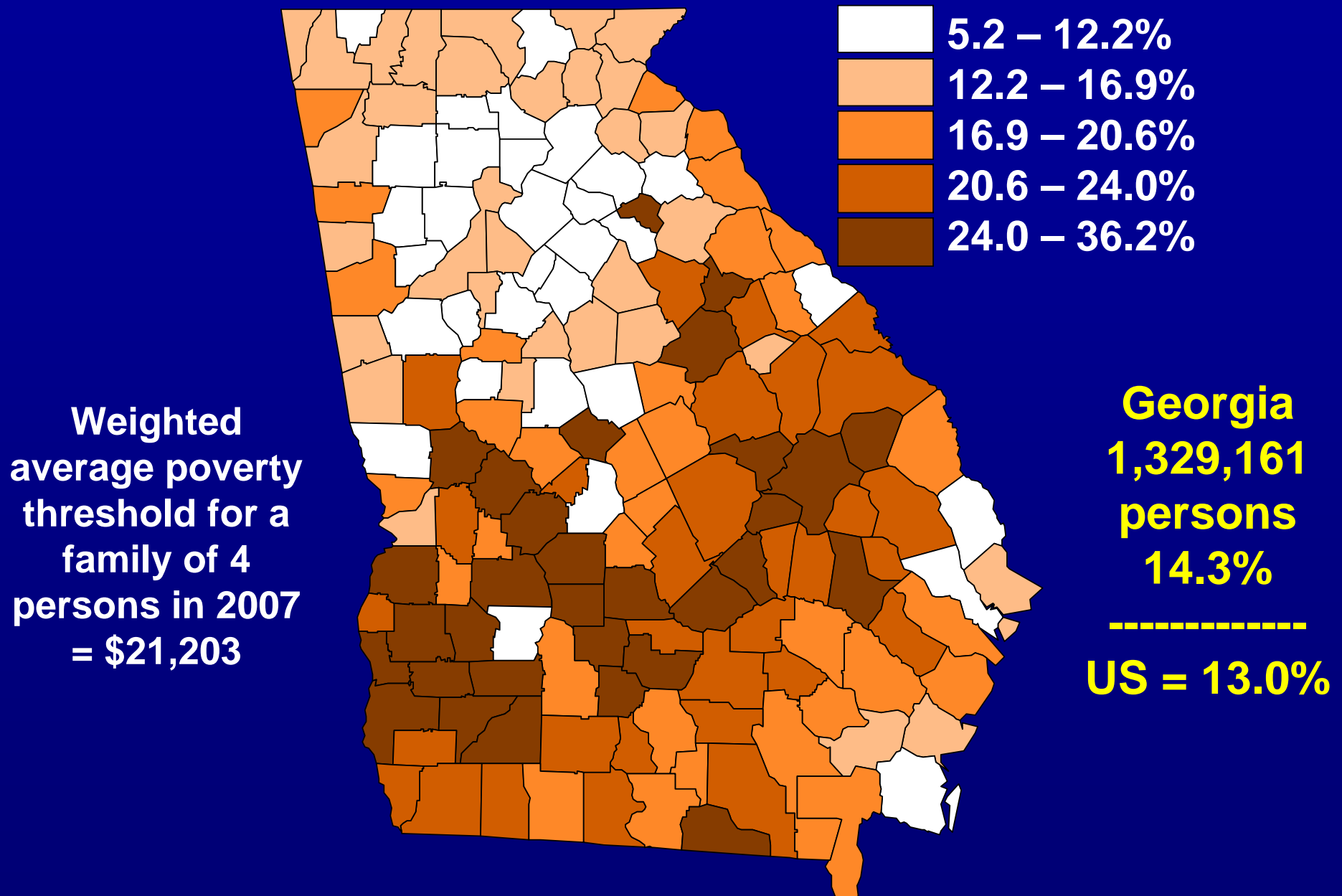

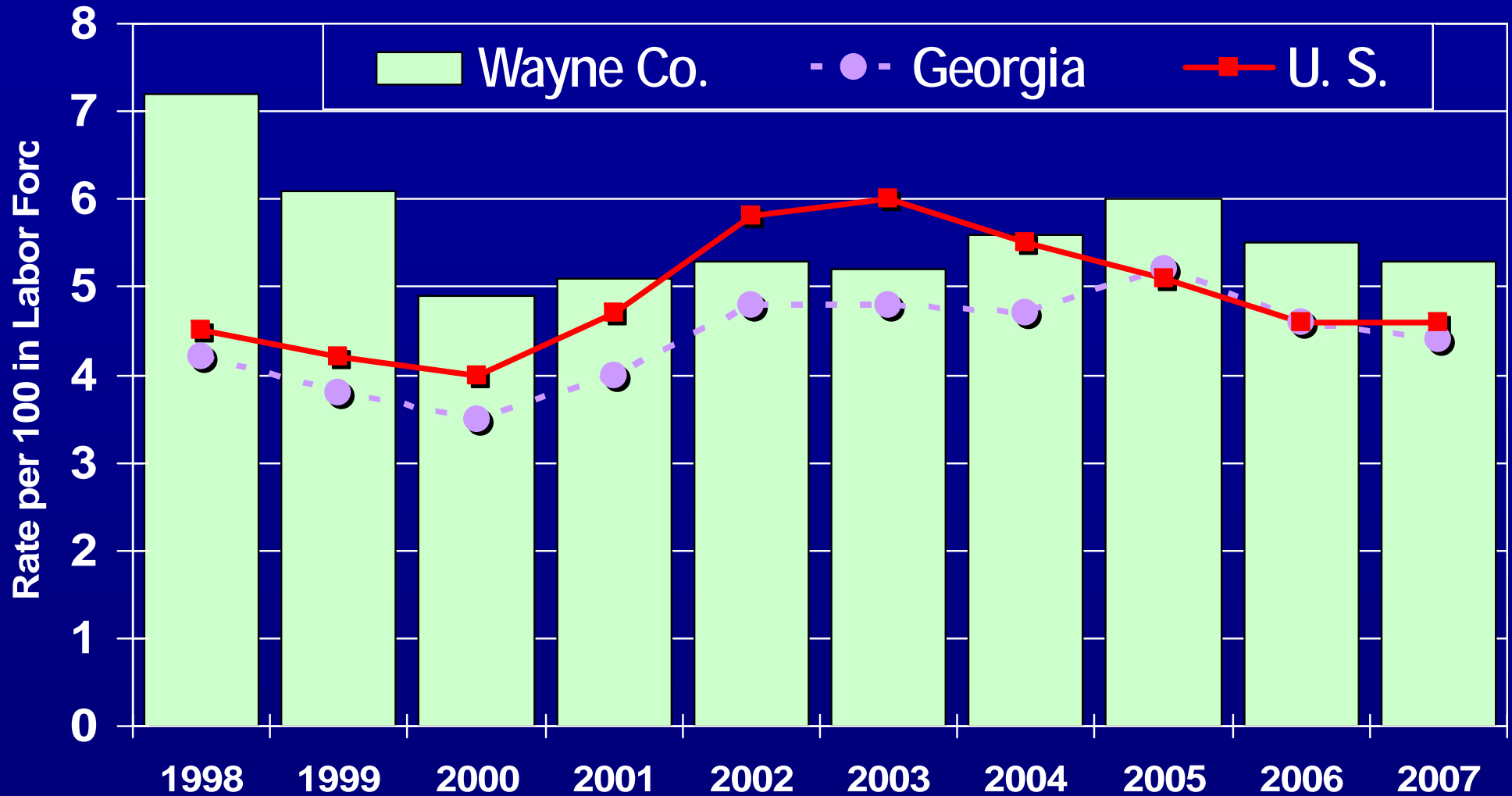

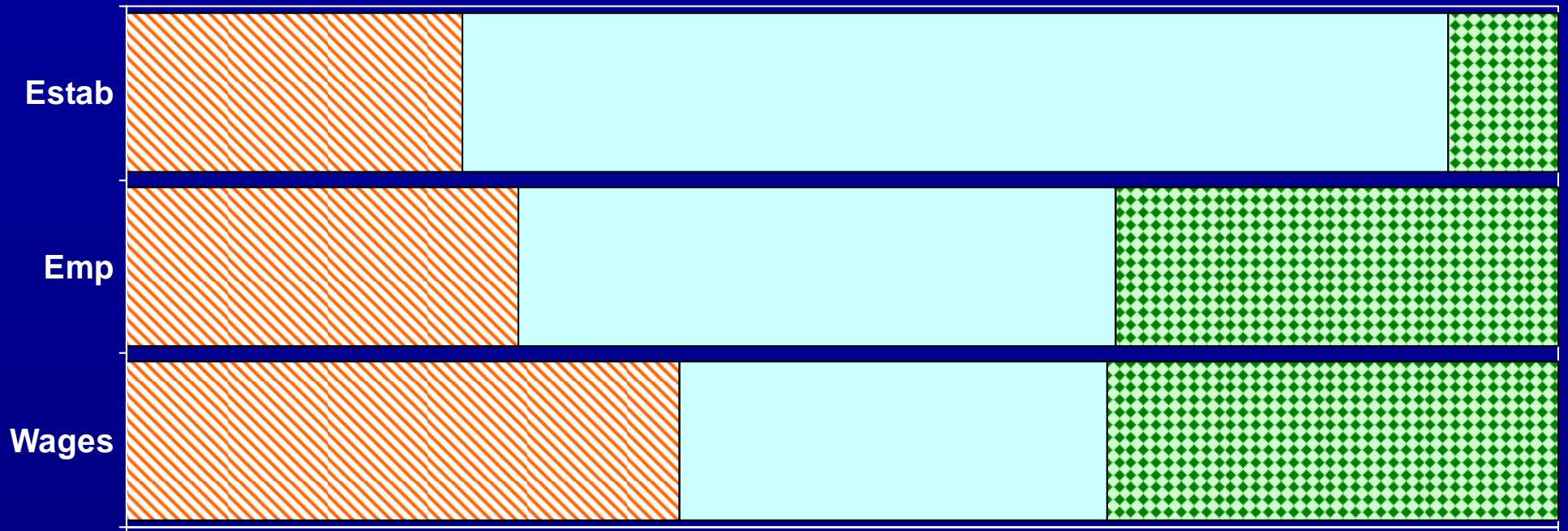

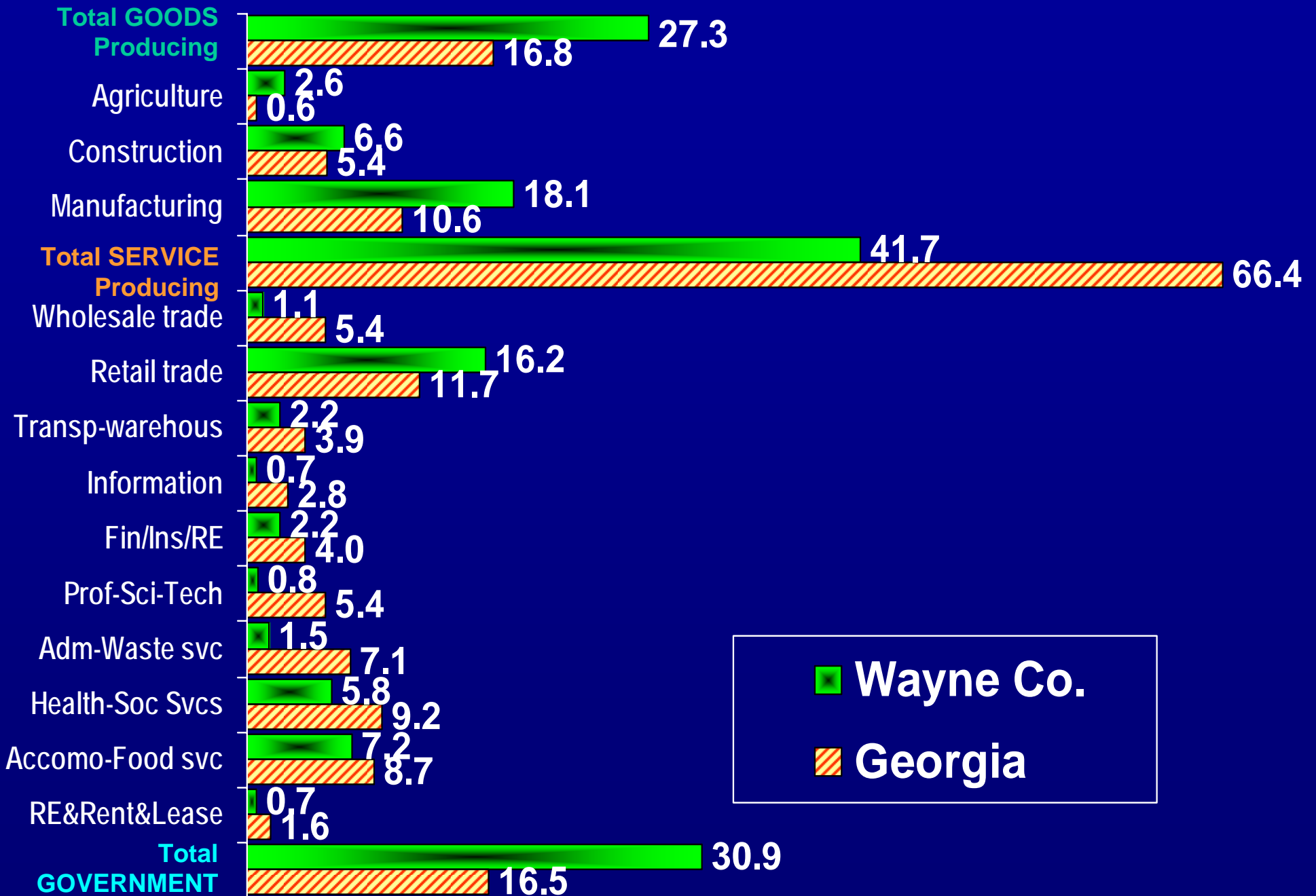

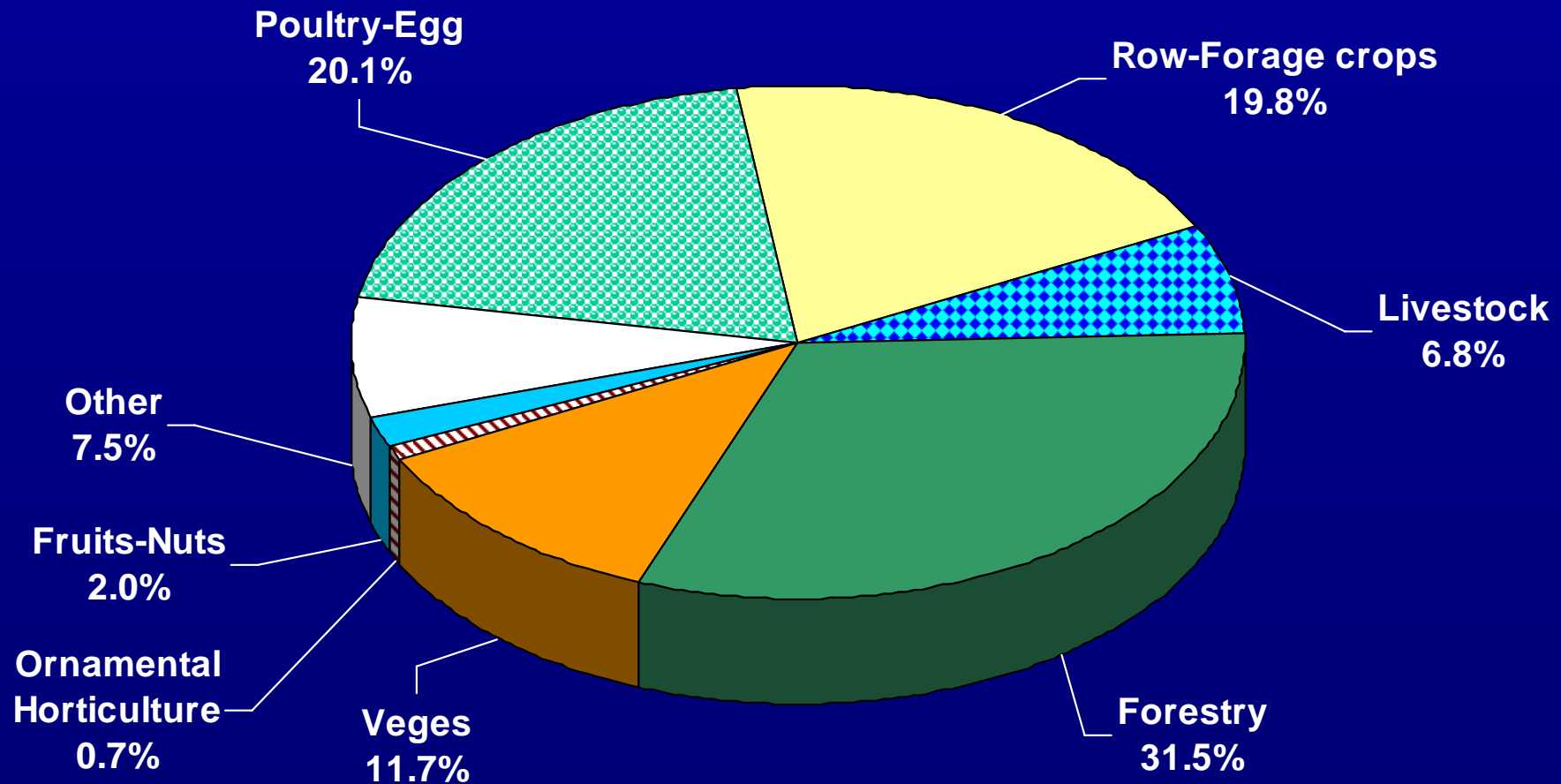

# Farm Gate Value by Commodity Group: 2007

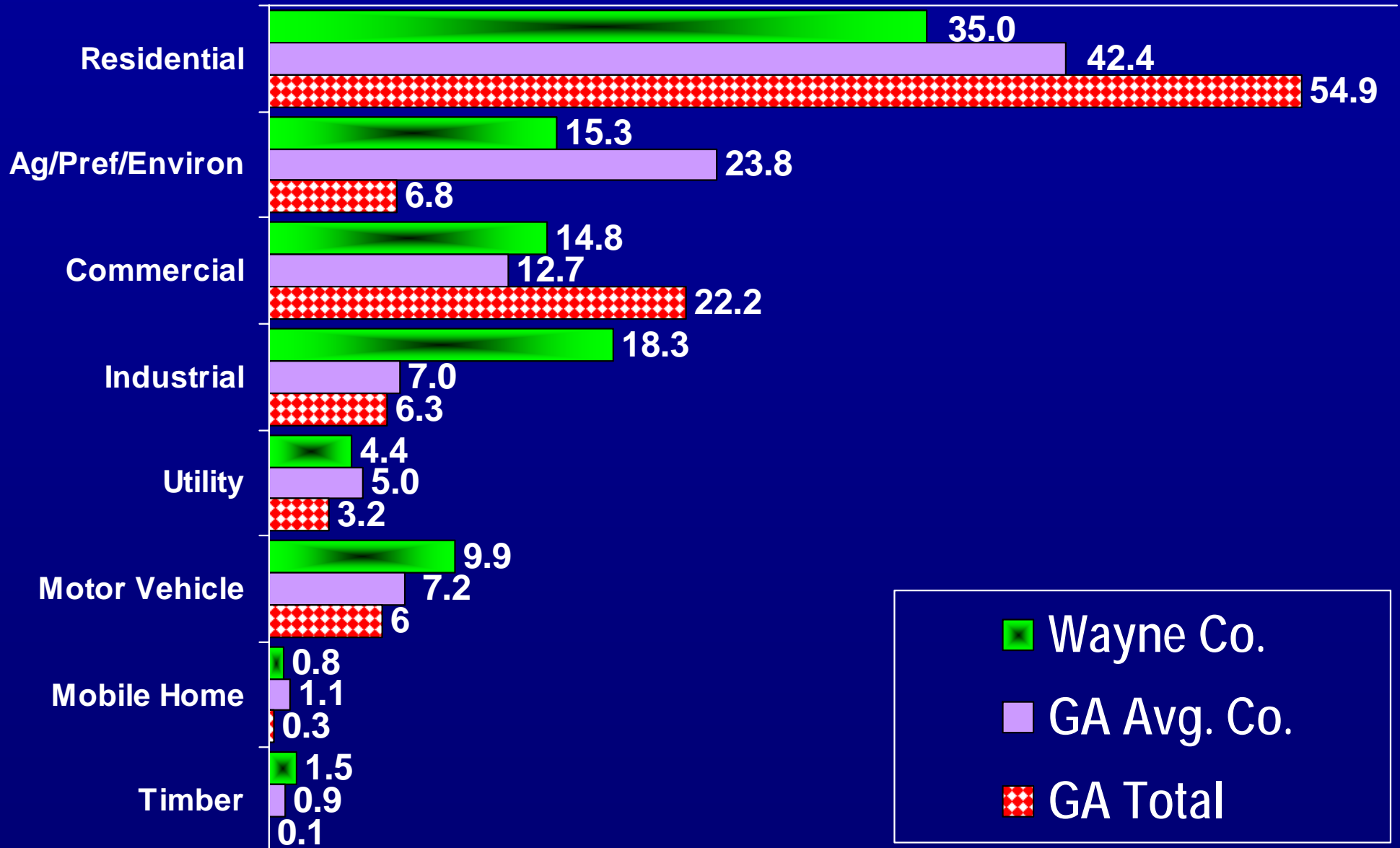

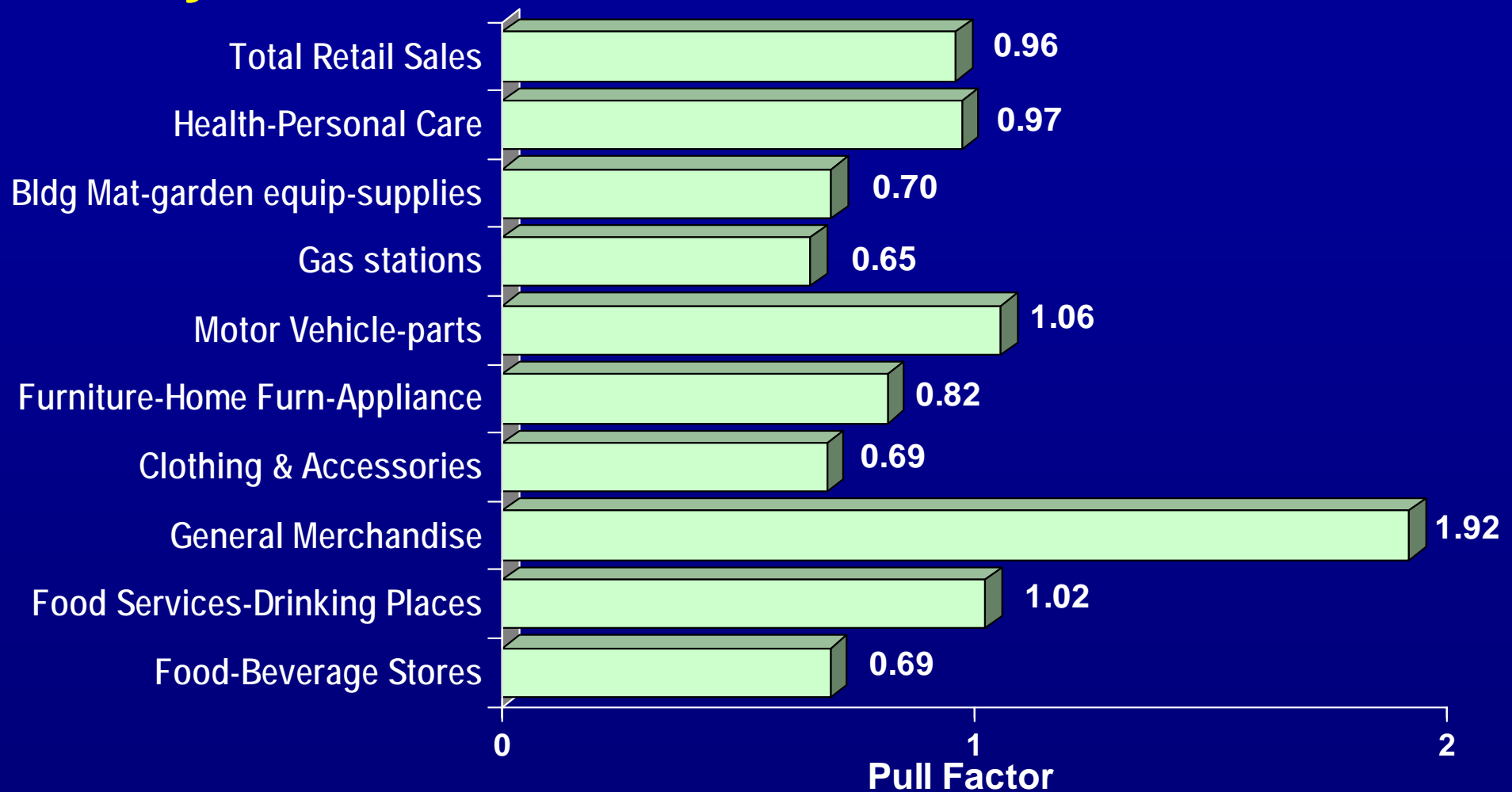

# Retail Sales Analysis: 2007

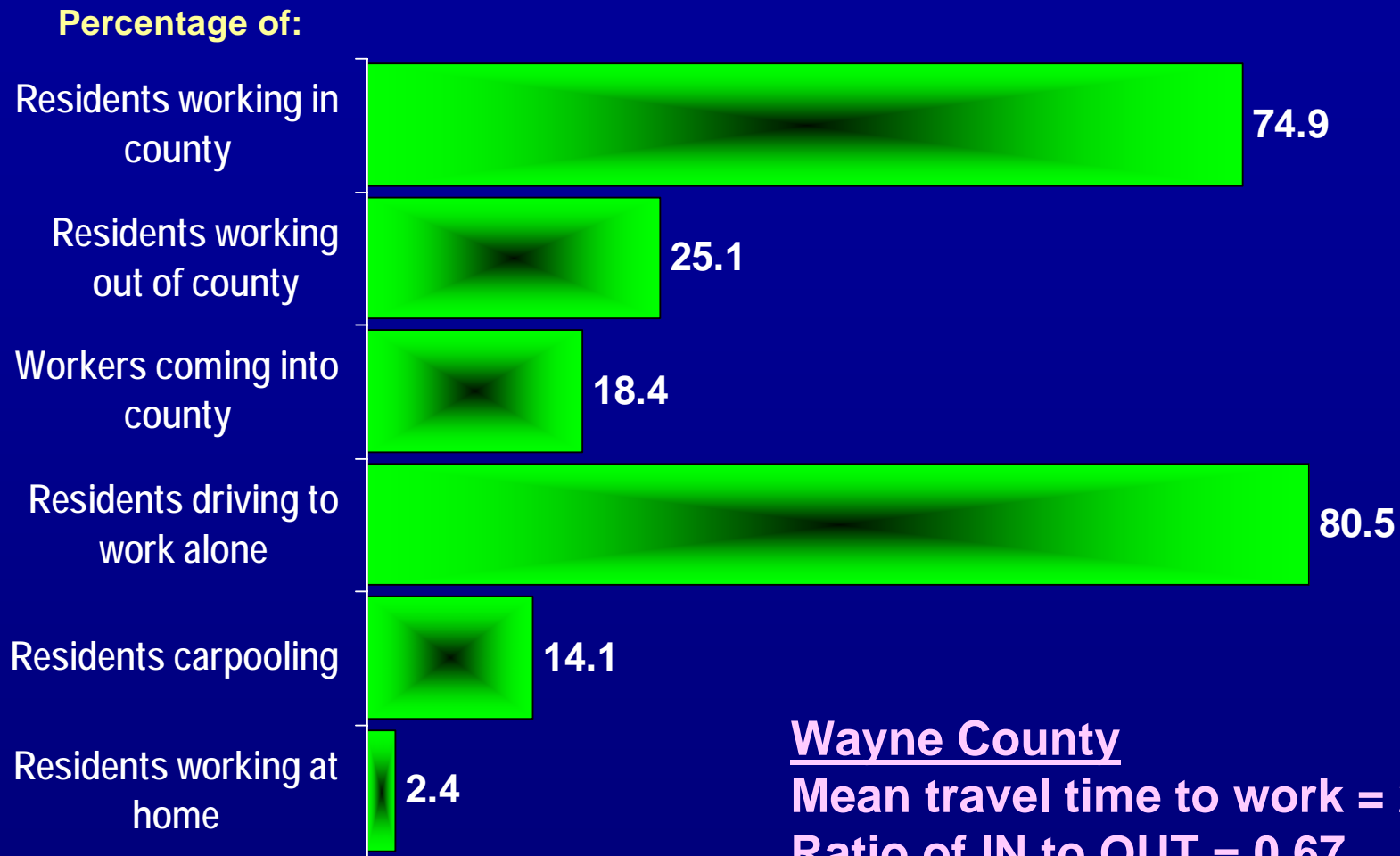
**Wayne Co. Total Retail Sales = \$344,662,000**
