Distinguished Alumni Award

Jim Tiller, who earned a Master's Degree in Landscape Architecture from the UGA College of Environment and Design in 1973, is a registered landscape architect and land planner with three decades of professional experience in all phases of Master Planning, Site Planning, Urban Design, Landscape Architecture and Detailed Landscape Construction. Former professor of Landscape Architecture at Ohio State University's prestigious School of Architecture, Tiller's expansive professional portfolio includes coastal and mountain resorts, parks and recreational facilities, golf course and retirement communities, military projects,

medical and commercial facilities, streetscape and urban designs, highway beautification, international projects, private residences, multi-family communities and private residential developments.

Dean's Award of Honor

Clay Mooney received his BLA *magna cum laude* from the College of Environment and Design in 1979. He owns the LA and Land Planning firm Design Associates based in Asheville, North Carolina. Clay is also registered in South Carolina, Georgia and Virginia and has been a member of ASLA since 1981. Clay has worked for the Land Planning Collaborative, John Broadbooks, and Six Associates. Clay has been actively involved with the College for many years. Because of his long standing involvement he has become an unofficial historian of the CEDAA and continues to play an integral role on the Steering Committee as its long standing secretary.
